HAMILTON FORMER FOOTBALL PLAYER HE HAS ACTED QUEERLY OF LATE

"Cinch" Hamilton, arrested this morning in connection with the jewelry store robbery, was one of the well known football men of the city during the seasons between 1895 and 1901.

After 1901 Hamilton went to Skamania county, Washington, where he went into the timber business, afterwards being elected county assessor for that county. Following his term of office he went into the slot machine business with Ed Davey of Portland and handled the Washington business.

After six months ago Hamilton and his wife came down the Columbia on the steamer Spencer. During the voyage a passenger sat down on one of the seats and set the place on fire.
