RACE WHITNEY DEAD IN SALT LAKE CITY

Was Well-Known Dramatic Critic and Husband of Rosemary Whitney.

Race Whitney, one of the best known newspaper men on the Pacific coast, died at Salt Lake City this morning. He was dramatic editor of The Journal for more than a year, leaving Portland in 1906.

Mr. Whitney, most versatile writer of news matter as well as dramatic criticisms, handled many of the features of the Lewis and Clark exposition during the summer of 1905, and made friends wherever he went.

There have been few critics on the Pacific coast who have had as much intimate knowledge of the drama and stage life as Race Whitney.

Mr. Whitney, who charmed the music lovers of Portland with his exquisite voice, is now playing the leading role in "The Merry Widow" in New York.

Separated from her husband for some time, she became united through the efforts of mutual friends while Mr. Whitney was in Portland, and she canceled an engagement in New York to marry and take up life with him on the Pacific coast.

Soon after Mr. Whitney left this city she returned to the stage.

DECLARE SANITATION OF SCHOOLS BAD

Mothers' Congress Lays Case Before Directors, Giving Many Instances.

In a report which conforms largely with one prepared by Dr. Esther C. Pohl, city health officer, the Oregon State Congress of Mothers laid before the school board yesterday the necessity of improving the sanitary conditions of the public schools at yesterday's board meeting.

Members of the mothers' congress based their report upon conditions found while visiting the schools in the winter months. The report pays particular attention to the unsanitary condition existing at Fulton Park school.
