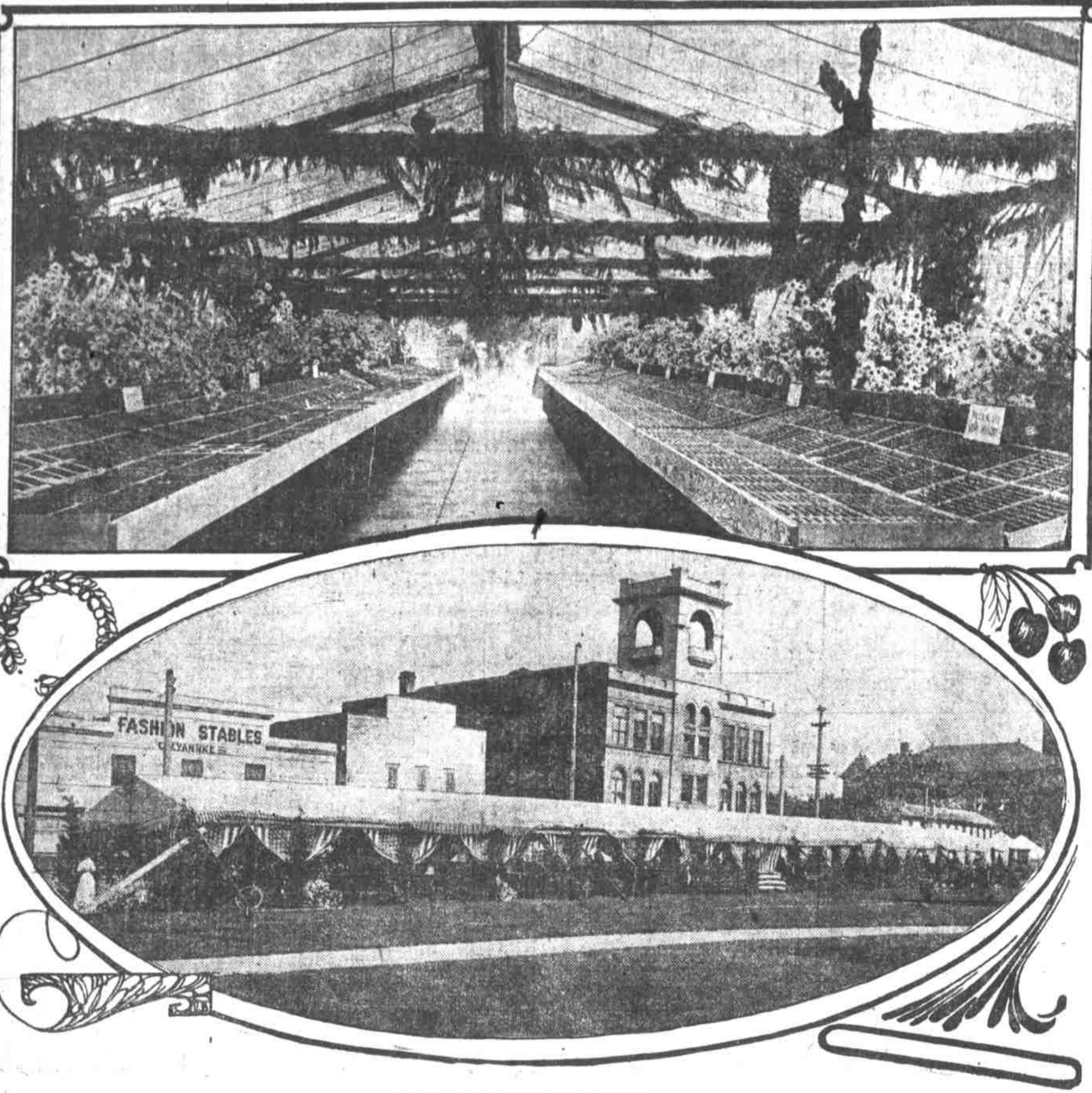

Representative horticulturists from all parts of the Pacific northwest will be in attendance, and addresses, conventions, lectures and demonstrations will be given which will be of the greatest educational value.

All were brought to Baker City last evening. J. Muller was proprietor of the Kentucky liquor store in this city, and one of the strongest and most substantial business men here.
