

MINERS CONDEMN "UNJUST WORDS"

Resent Reference to Mexican Members as Moyers and Haywoods of Mexico.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Denver, July 25.—The Western Federation of Miners today passed a resolution condemning the federal government for the alleged scheming to allow the kidnapping of four Mexican members of the organization at Douglas, Ariz., at the behest of the Mexican government which claims they were revolutionists and had organized forces on this side of the line to attempt the overthrow of Diaz.

The Mexicans were classed as the "Moyers and Haywoods of Mexico" and the federation will take steps to have them returned to the United States.

A resolution was adopted asking for a federal commission to investigate the deaths of miners in the mines of Alaska through faulty working places. It was claimed that the companies are never held responsible and no inquests are held over the dead.

A resolution to take in other crafts than miners precipitated a long discussion which was still on when the convention adjourned. Officers will probably be elected on Monday afternoon or at the latest Tuesday morning.

President Charles H. Moyer will be re-elected president without opposition.

as will Secretary-Treasurer Ernest H. Mills.

Vice-President Charles E. Mahoney will be opposed, but it is believed the administration leaders will pull him through.

Practically every one of the executive board will be opposed. James Kirwin will not stand for reelection to the board. He is too busy running for sheriff out in the Black Hills.

**COLORADO BANKERS
CONDEMN PLATFORM**

Colorado Springs, Colo., July 25.—The Colorado Bankers' association today adopted a resolution condemning the Bryan plank in the Denver platform relating to bank guarantees. The resolution is as follows:

"The question of the guaranteeing of deposits in a bank is an economical as well as a political question, and we believe the people of the state are entitled to the judgment of the bankers on a subject of this importance.

"The proposition that the government should guarantee the accounts of depositors in national banks has no more foundation in the rights than would a proposition that the government should guarantee the payment of loans made by national banks, and the enactment into law of laws of this class would be a subversion of the principles of sound banking."

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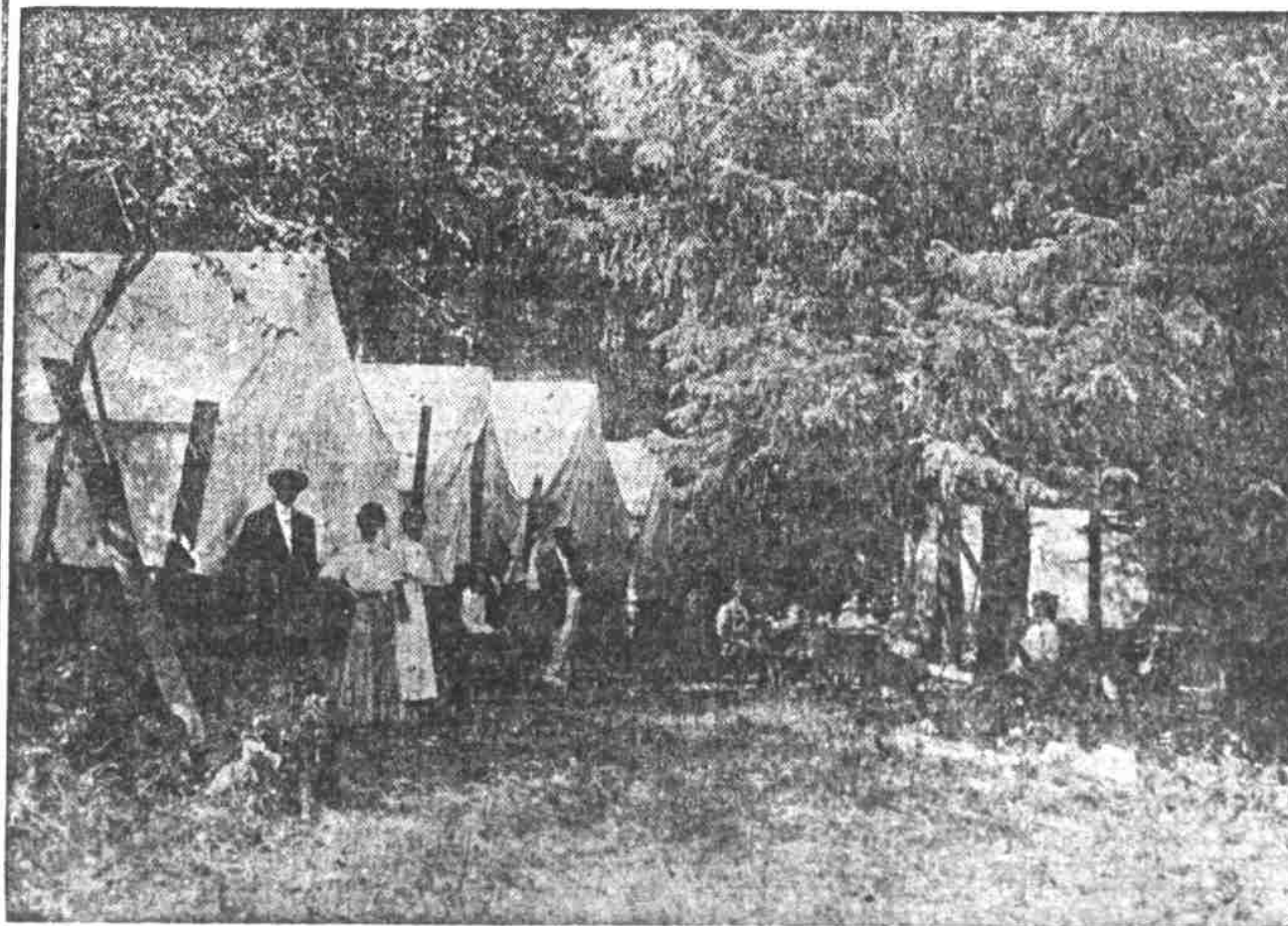
