

HILL WAYS TERMINAL

PUT CHECK ON DIPHTHERIA

School Directors Favor Dr. Pohl's Request for Inspectors and Nurse.

Harriman Will Permit the North Bank to Lay Main Line Crossing Into North Portland—Exchange for Old U. P. Grade to Sound.

Story from Tacoma, if true, means the Portland terminal war between the Hill and Harriman railroad companies at an end, and that the Spokane, Portland & Seattle railroad will be permitted to lay its main line crossings over Harriman tracks in North Portland, giving the north bank road entrance to its new terminal yards.

It is said Hill has for this concession, and some cash to boot, traded the old Union Pacific grade and right of way between Portland and the sound, a portion of which fell to the Northern Pacific back in 1894 as a result of the panic and failure of an attempt by the Union Pacific to cross the Columbia river here and build to Port Townsend.

Will Use Old Grade.

Harriman is said to intend using the old grade to build the Oregon & Washington railroad between Portland and Tacoma. He has long delayed this construction, pending a settlement of the whole list of controversies between Northern lines and their rivals south of the Columbia, and in the reported settlement now reached, it is alleged the two rival interests have come to an agreement on the old Pacific grade to the Columbia river bridge, exchange of certain terminal courtesies at Tacoma, Spokane, Lewiston and Seattle, and the turning over of the old Union Pacific grade to Harriman as far north as Tacoma.

The remainder of the old grade, from Olympia to Tacoma, is to be utilized by the Hill interests in making extensions on the Olympic peninsula, and a connection is to be effected between them and the main land by opening the Kalama-Gabla ferry between Port Ludlow and Everett as soon as the Vancouver bridge of the north bank road is in operation.

NORTH BANK ROAD NOW CARRYING MAIL

The north bank railroad began carrying mail between Vancouver, Wash., and Pasco yesterday. Three clerks who will make their headquarters in Portland have been assigned to the run. As soon as the Columbia and Willamette bridges are completed and the Spokane, Portland & Seattle begins running trains directly into Portland all mail cars on the run will start from the passenger station here. Under the present system the numerous postoffices along the line of the north bank are supplied with mail from the railroad stations on the Oregon side of the Columbia, owing to the fact that the mail is carried across the river in boats, which always necessitates a delay. The new system of mail delivery will greatly facilitate the handling of mail matter along the southern border of the state of Washington. As soon as night trains are put on by the north bank, it is felt additional mail clerks will be added to the run.
