SELECT CHARTER MEMBERS SOON

Council Committee Will Name Revisionists of City Government.

After a discussion of the work which will come before the committee of 15 to revise the city charter, Mayor Lane, Councilman Baker and Councilman Cellars yesterday decided that they would wait until Monday at 4 o'clock before naming the members of the committee. This action was taken because of the desire on the part of the members of the nominating committee to secure only the citizens who best understand the work to serve on the committee.

Before adjourning yesterday the nominating committee decided that each member should select five names and present them Monday if they are acceptable to all the committee they will be named, but the members stated yesterday that they wanted only the best men and that if any member of the committee knew such against the men proposed that they would welcome the information. The desire of the committee is to place the matter above politics and secure the men who will give their best efforts to the work.

The lists of names furnished by the various civic organizations were studied yesterday and many of the names were acceptable to all the committee and it is probable that several of the committee of 15 will be chosen from these lists.
