WIZARD'S START FOR ST. HELENS

Ascent of Snow-Capped Peak Begins Tomorrow Morning

Leaving Portland yesterday afternoon, the Mazamas reached Castlerock last evening, remained there overnight and today they journeyed to Toutles river bridge, from where the start will be made tomorrow morning on their ascent of Mount St. Helens.

The party will leave Toutles river bridge tomorrow morning and by evening they will be in camp at Spirit Lake, 5,239 feet above sea level, where the main headquarters for the outing have been established.

Beautiful Lakes to Visit. One of the pleasantest side trips is to American lake, about one and a half miles north of Spirit Lake, 1,720 feet higher.

On the south side of the mountain occur wonderful openings in the lava rock, formed by trees. Substation Applied for to Serve About 1,000 Patrons.

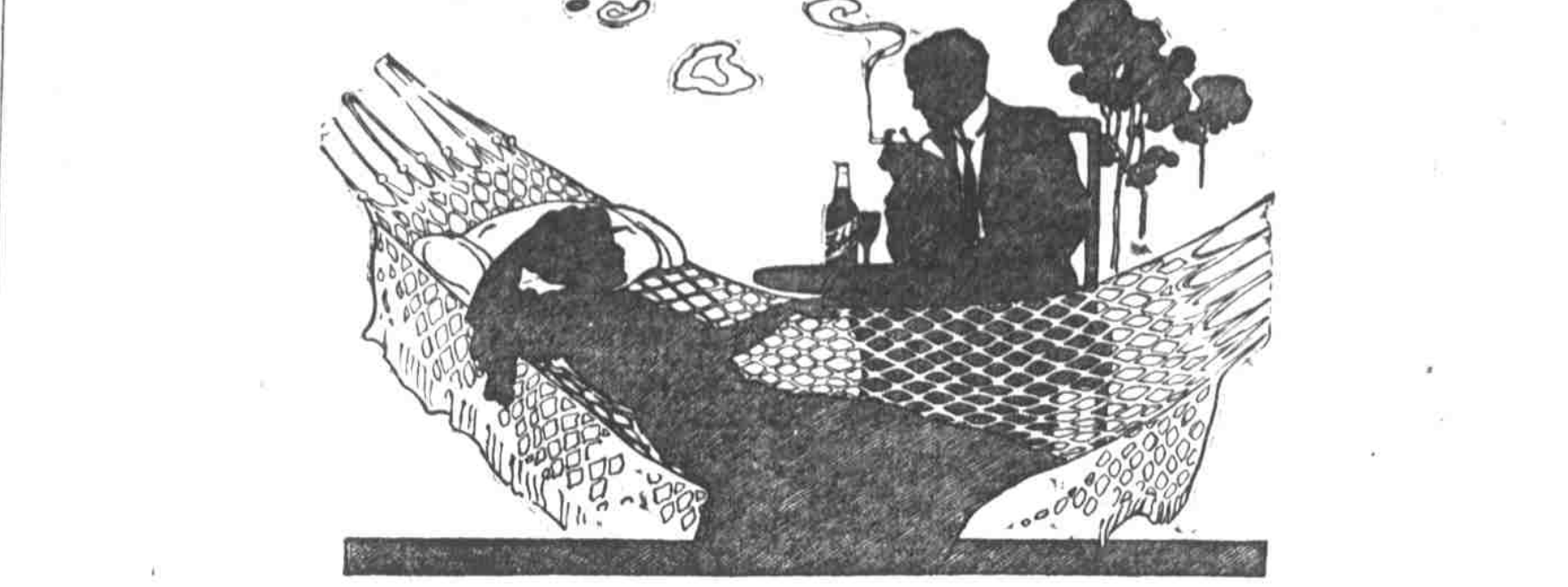
