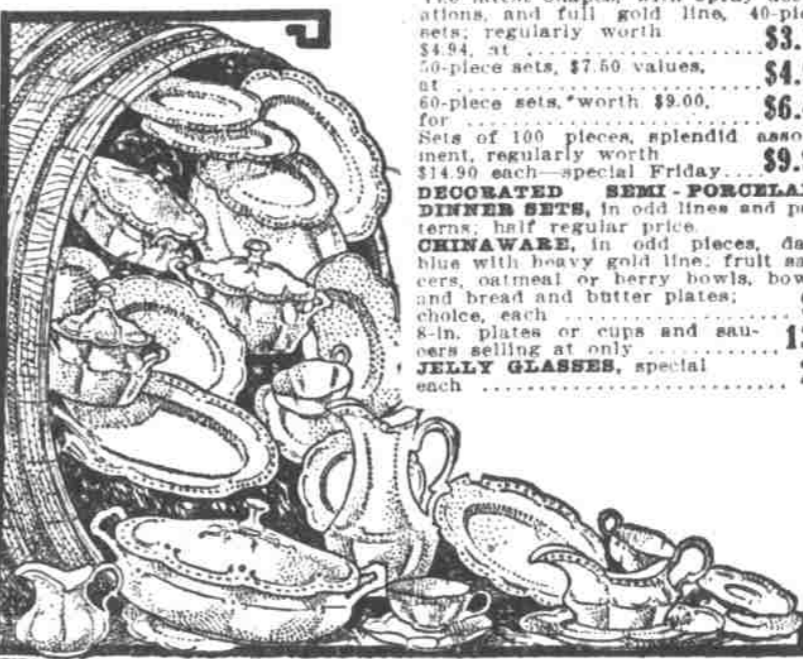

## OFFICER KILLS SALOON ROBBER

### Two Seattle Youths, Out of Work, Looked for Some Easy Money.

(United Press Leased Wire)  
San Francisco, Aug. 6.—Scott Tounds, 19 years of age, who lived at 112 1/2 Eighth street, South Seattle, was shot and instantly killed early today by Police Officer M. T. Arce.  
Ray C. Baird, aged 18 years of age, who claims to be the son of the Standard Oil agent at Seattle, a companion of Tounds, is under arrest for burglary.  
The killing and the arrest were the culmination of an exciting chase for three blocks after the two boys, who the police charged had been discovered in the act of robbing a saloon at Fifth and Mission streets. Arce heard a noise in the saloon and entered through a door from which the glass had been removed. As he did so the two youths dashed out of the door and ran.  
The policeman gave chase and ordered the boys to stop. They refused and he fired at Tounds. The shot

His friends today indignantly attacked the verdict and state that they will attempt to disprove it so as to remove the stigma from the dead man's name.

## DRUMMERS SAY NO MORE TIPPING

### Organization Forming to Secure Square Deal and Cut Out Graft.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal)  
Milwaukee, Wis., Aug. 6.—The water porter and the helpline with the tipping scam must go. The tipping custom must be abolished.  
This is the edict of the traveling men of the country assembled in Milwaukee today to complete the organization of the National Travelers' association. The proposed organization is to serve as a clearing house for all complaints from commercial travelers. The tipping evil heads the list of grievances, and is to be given first attention. When that problem has been solved the association will work to secure clean towels, six-foot umbrellas, adequate fire escapes and other things which the drummers believe themselves entitled to, but which they do not always receive. The hands of the hotel proprietors. The present meeting will be in session during the remainder of this week. Before it adjourns it is expected that the national organization will be given a good start and within a few months it is hoped to have a membership of not less than 50,000. The association will take in members of both of the national organizations of traveling men now existing.  
The association will aim to bring about the desired reforms through the medium of the law. Committees will be appointed to go before the legislatures of the different states the coming winter and speak in support of the measures to do away with the tipping system and discrimination in hotel rates against the traveling salesman.

### Proposes to Confine Saloons to Hotels in Yukon District.

Victoria, B. C., Aug. 6.—The movement of the temperance cause throughout the continent has brought it even thus early as far north as the Arctic circle. One of the first measures offered to the Yukon legislature, the annual session of which has just opened, is a bill for the elimination of all saloons within the territory, inclusive of Dawson City, and giving only to properly equipped hotels the right to sell intoxicants.
