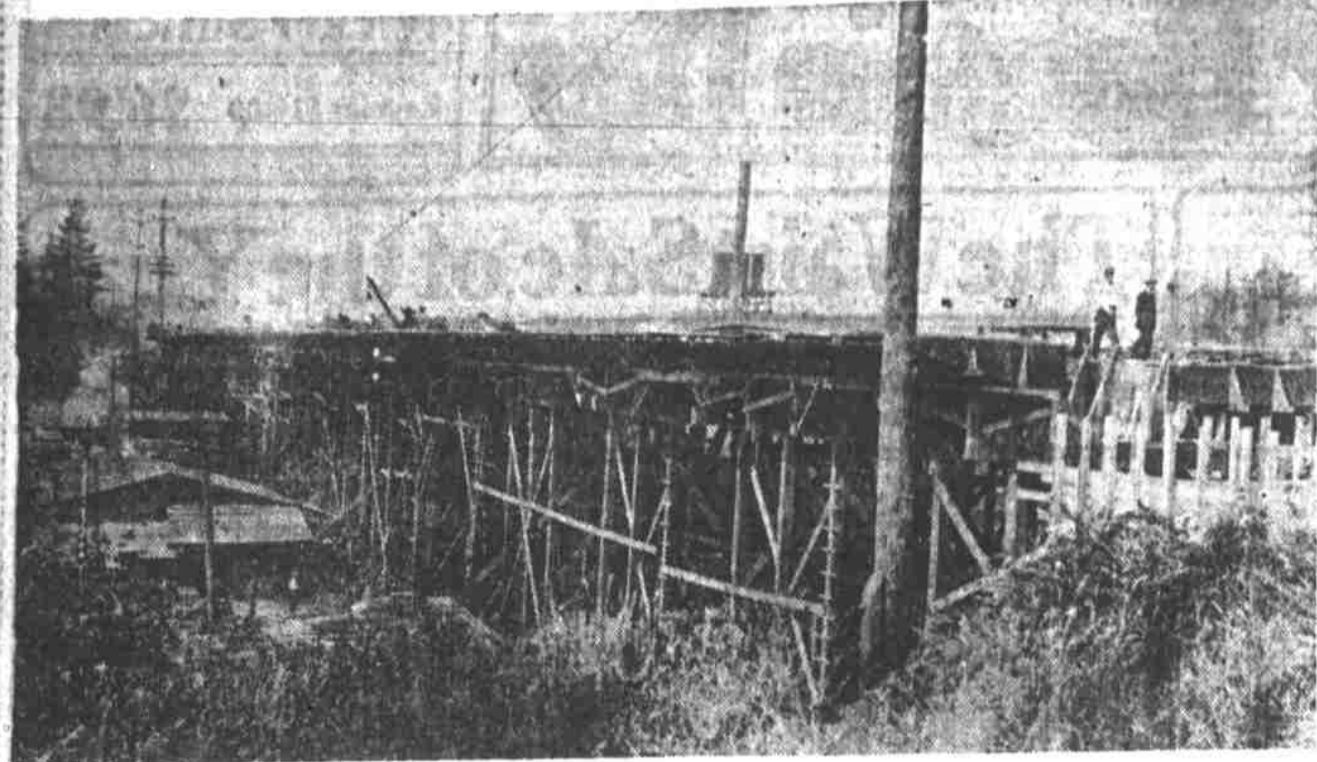


BUILD 580-FOOT CEMENT BRIDGE IN 30 DAYS



Frame Work of Bridge on East Twenty-Eighth Street, Ready to Receive Concrete Mixture. To complete a reinforced steel concrete bridge 580 feet in length within 30 days is considered somewhat of a feat but that is what the Northwest Bridge company expects to do with the East Twenty-eighth street structure now that the framework has been erected.
