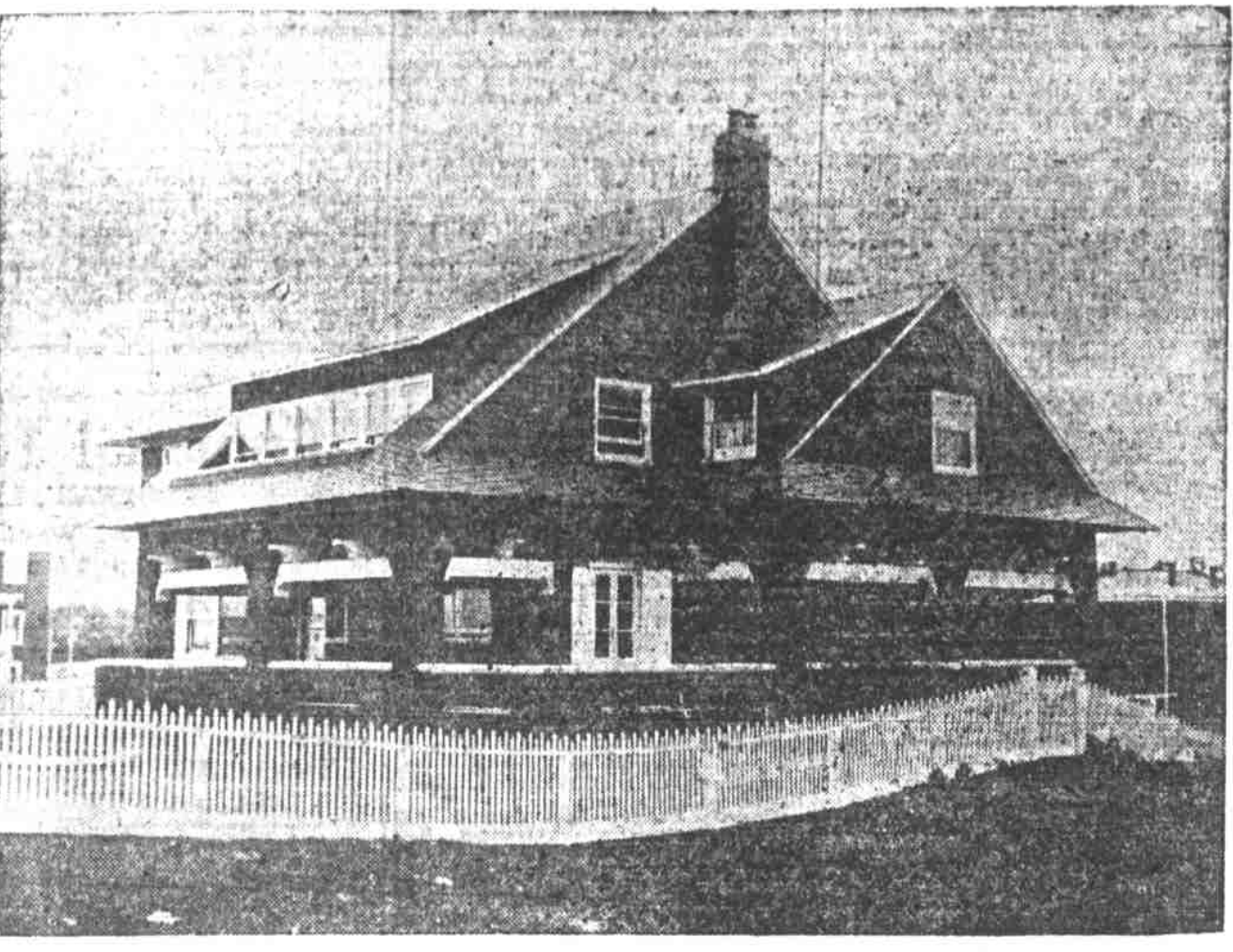
Many Social Events.

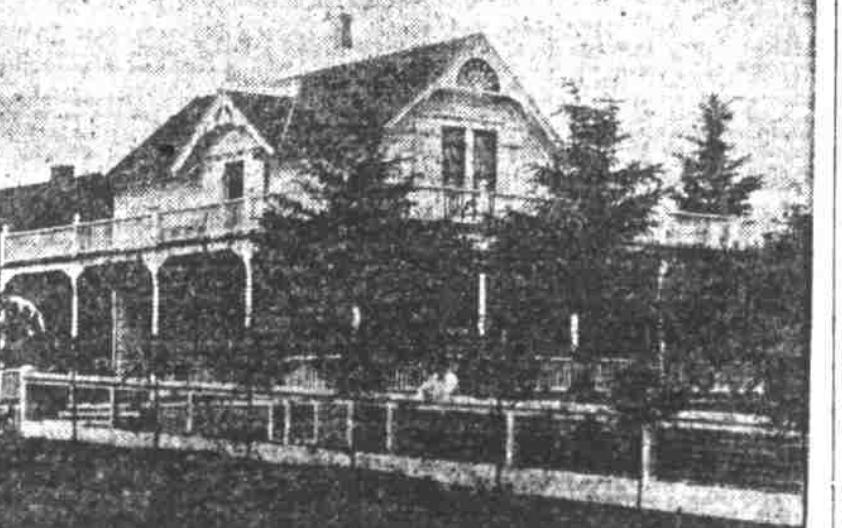

North Shore Resorts
North Beach, Wash.; Aug. 8.—All along North Beach the resorts are in the heart of the beach season. Those who have saved the best of the summer for a stay at the beach are coming in today. The hotels, cottages, camps and camps the cares of business and household duties are put aside and the spirit of outing and vacation rules supreme. The active follow the beach amusements with enthusiasm and those less actively inclined rest and regain their health in the sunshine and ocean breezes. At night the beach is illuminated with bonfires till the 14 miles of sand looks like the camp of an invading army. When the tide is low the mobiles run up and down the beach and take parties to the points of interest. On the bars when the life-saving crew give their drill hundreds visit the

station and watch the sturdy little crew take the surfboat out over the breakers. There is horseback riding, bowling and fishing for all. Parsons' orchestra of Portland has arrived at Long Beach and is giving dances in the old Long Beach hall. Two nights a week the orchestra plays for dances in the ballroom at the breakers.

The City of Tents.
A notable feature at North Beach this year is the great increase in the number of campers. On the strip of land which lays between Long Beach and Seaview and back of the cottages, hundreds of families are spending the summer in tents. The camp ground is shaded and protected by trees and some of the places look very picturesque. It is an easy matter to get water and most of the things are supplied with driven wells. There is any quantity of driftwood on the beach and the camper's small boy has an inexhaustible source of supply for the kitchen wood box. Razor clams are plentiful on the beach now and every tent has its share. Agents of the tenting business are busy with the old custom of bringing a season's stock of provisions here. The camps are lit by campfires and Chinese lanterns hang from the trees. In this campsite there is a spirit of democracy. The tent dwellers come to the beach for an outing of rest and comfort. They bathe in the surf, fish on the beach and pick berries in the hills. They are up early in the morning after shellfish and ready at night for any amusement from the camping life. The tenting business is a most striking feature in the soft straw hat with the red banana band worn by the men and women. At the postoffice, the bowling alley and the station the camper is always found, the happiest on the beach.

Clam Bake.
One of the most striking social events that has ever taken place at North Beach was the clam bake given Saturday night in Breakers station by George Boschke, chief engineer of the Hartman line in Oregon. Over 60 guests enjoyed Mr. Boschke's hospitality and the best of the beach. A large bonfire burned in the center of the park and Chinese lanterns were strung from the trees. Parsons' orchestra furnished music during the supper. The guests were seated at long tables which were lighted by the fire in the center in true old New England style and served at the tables.
