

PASTOR CORDOVA FREE MAN AGAIN

Original Affinity Man and Has Served Term Without Repentance.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Trenton, N. J., Aug. 14.—This morning the doors of the state prison of New Jersey were opened and J. Frank Cordova, the well-known South River pastor, was set forth in free man, after having served three years, four months and 11 days as a result of his mistaken views on the subject of affinity.

It was about four years ago that the case of Cordova first attracted the public attention and was discussed from one end of the country to the other. It was the original "affinity" case, and it was the only case of its kind in the history of the United States.

There still remained a chance for Cordova to reform himself, but the "affinity" creed had taken too strong hold of him. One day he and Miss Bowen disappeared from the village, the pastor saying his wife and children were dead. He was found by a few friends who still stood by him and persuaded to return to his former wife.

According to reports Cordova expects to make Newark his home. Miss Bowen is said to be waiting for him in retirement with her child at Ocean Grove. That she will immediately rejoin him seems certain. Cordova refuses to discuss the matter, but says he expects now to be "happy."
