An interesting aftermath of the games, however, is found in the vicarious career of the American Olympic athletes since the games were finished.

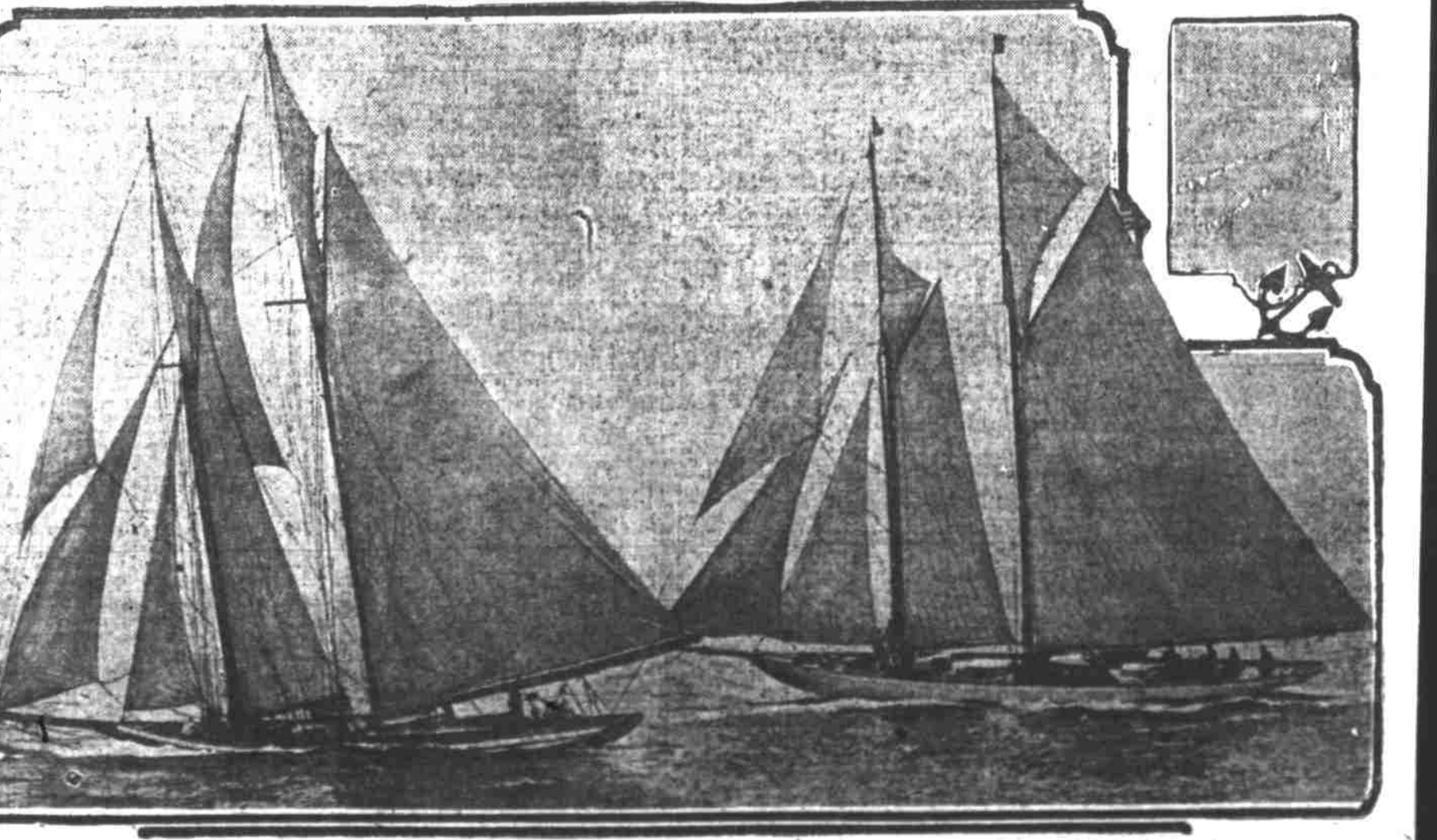
In Dublin, in Paris, in Edinburgh and in Stockholm, the Americans have shown their better winning at the Stadium was on form.
