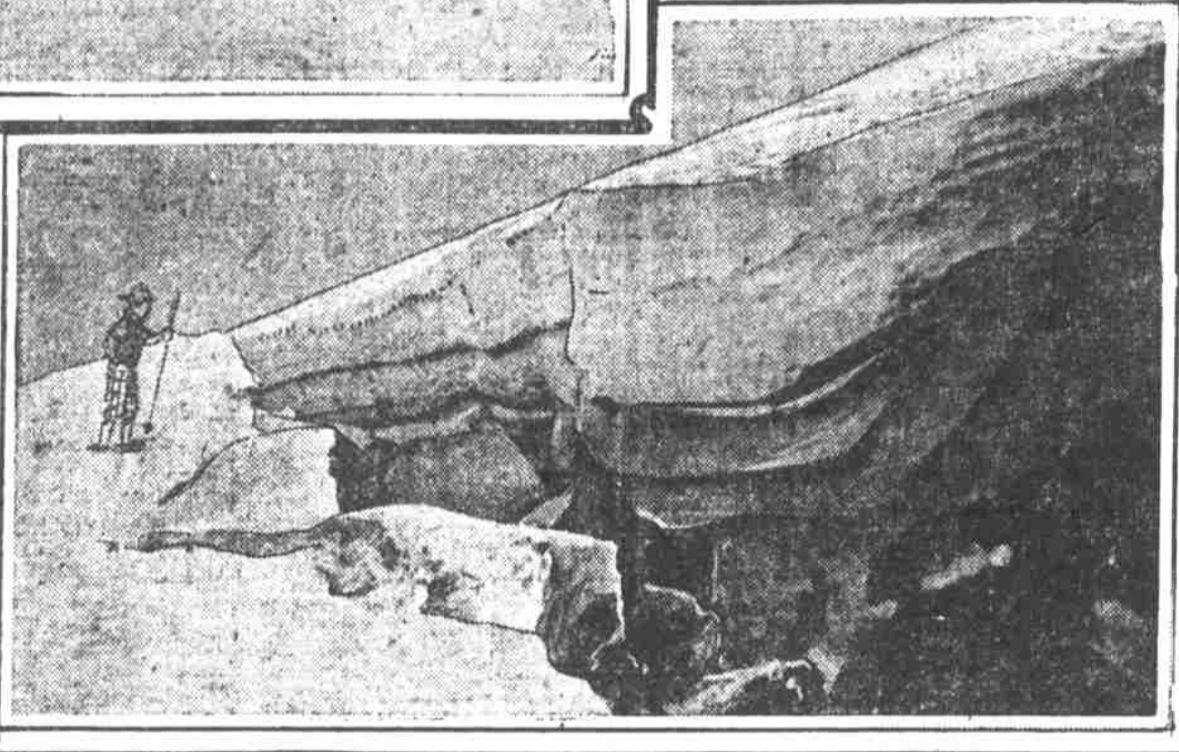


CLIMBING MOUNTAIN'S PRECIPITOUS SIDE WITH MEMBERS OF THE MAZAMAS

SALMON FLEET ON WAY HOME

Tug North Star Reaches Astoria From Nushagak River.

SAILORS EXPECTED SOON TO FOLLOW

Three Ships, the St. Nicholas, Berlin and Henry Villard Left for Bristol Bay Early in the Spring to Bring Back Season's Pack.

The tug North Star reached Astoria this morning from Nushagak, Bristol Bay, Alaska. This means that within the next few days the fleet of wind-jammers that went north from Columbia river will be heading into the river with the season's pack at the canneries owned by Portland and Astoria interests.

The vessels that left here early in the spring for the canneries were the bark Henry Villard, the ship St. Nicholas and Berlin. These are all of the old school of American sailing vessels, reputed to be fast sailers even in their old age. The Berlin and St. Nicholas have been in the canneries fleet many seasons but this is the first year of the Henry Villard.

The Villard was sent north instead of the bark Emily Reed which went on the beach near Chitukook last spring when on the way from Newcastle to this port with a cargo of coal. Missing the bearings the captain kept the vessel on her course till she got into the breakers when there was no possible chance of getting her into deeper water.

Besides the salmon pack, the ships will bring the crews that worked at the beach near Chitukook last spring and about 200 men on board. A large number of the men are Japanese and some Chinese.

VALUABLE CARGOES START.

Steamers Arabia and Hford Leave for Foreign Destinations.

Two large steamers, the British liner Arabia, left today this morning bound for foreign ports with freight valued at nearly \$225,000, the cargoes consisting entirely of products native of this region.

It is learned that interesting facts regarding the Pence company and the connection of J. Thorburn Ross therewith may be brought out. The Pence company, which has on foot large plans for improvements at the exposition grounds, is one of the companies to which the bond was made by the Title Guarantee & Trust company during its palmy days.

The circuit court inquiry has been set on foot by an attorney acting for the plaintiff in the case of Allen C. Durbin, of Chicago, against Life Pence, Durbin and Pence, some members of congress together and Pence owed the Chicagoan \$42,577. A civil draft by Durbin in 1904 brought no funds and in November 1906, judgment was given in the circuit court for the full amount of the draft, with 175 for attorney fees and \$27 for costs.

The court records show that supplemental proceedings to require Pence to make an inventory of his property were started after the sheriff had announced that he could not find any property upon which to levy. These proceedings were continued by consent until January 7, 1907, but nothing appears to have been done on that date. The court records show that the attorney for Durbin has stimulated the attorney for Pence to take action to try to collect the judgment.

SAVE LIFE AND MONEY

Councilmen Find That Adequate Medical Inspection of Public Schools Will Be Good Financial Move—Figures Give New Light.

That Portland will have an adequate school inspection for the coming year is now expected despite the fact that the ways and means committee of the city council refused to appropriate \$250 for two inspectors and a school nurse at its last meeting. Since that time several of the councilmen have made personal investigation of the question and have come to the conclusion that the inspectors are essential to protect public health.

The reason the councilmen refused to grant the request at its last meeting was because of the shortage of city funds. But the great importance of the work and the small amount of the appropriation has convinced them that such an expenditure would be not only a great protection to public health, but also a shrewd financial move.

The financial saving from such an appropriation would be made by saving the city from a great expense incurred from epidemics of the kind which flourished last year.

The councilmen were so convinced of the importance of the work that they have decided to carry the health department through the year from dipping into the ways and means committee that the money was largely responsible for the epidemic of typhoid fever last year.

But it is not only this year's epidemic that has caused a change of mind among the councilmen. When they investigated the health reports they discovered that on an average three children die each month of the disease. The number of cases reported is very high. As soon as the school closes for the summer vacation the number of cases falls to almost nothing, while a death from diphtheria in July, August and September is rare.

That this dreadful mortality among the young children could be prevented or greatly lessened by an expenditure of only a few hundred dollars is asserted strongly to the councilmen, and it is believed that they will grant the necessary appropriation. PARENTS' FAITH IS STILL FIRM

Brittans Believe That Convict Breen Will Restore Their Boy.

Walla Walla, Wash., Aug. 15.—Leaving the father and mother of the missing Brittan boy waiting at the toll gate for him to bring the child to them in 15 minutes, James Breen, pardoned from the state penitentiary to rescue the lad, never came back. After waiting in vain for his return, the Brittans came back to town, having given up all hope of ever finding the lost child. Breen had told them the boy would be brought back yesterday at 2 o'clock, but he never came.

Mr. Brittan found the people who had bought the horse Breen said was shot from under him on a former trip and confronted him with the evidence. Breen boasted he could live in the mountains there for 20 years and never be captured.

"I will defy them to get me, and I will prove they can't," he said.

On the other hand, circumstances look like Breen may be truthful. He left his coat and all his money when he went down the trail after the boy. He had had opportunity to escape before with two weeks' start and on horseback with \$300; this time he was without coat, money or guns. The Brittans waited only two hours for him before they gave up. He told them there was trouble about the reward and he would have to get men to steal the boy. The parents this morning think he may yet bring the boy home.
