Champion Puts Californian Out in Second Round After Four Knockdowns.

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, Aug. 17.—Stanley Ketchel, the grand Michigan fighter, won from Joe Thomas, the California heavyweight, after a minute and a half of fierce knocking in the second round of a 20 round bout last night. The champion was so much superior to Thomas at all kinds of fighting that there was never any question of the result. Ketchel landed a series of punches and scored two knockdowns in one round. The fourth knocking Thomas got weak that he could not even continue the second battle. As he was being counted out by Referee Eddie Smith, Captain Anderson lay on the ropes and motioned Smith to stop the fight.

The timely intervention of the crowd saved Thomas from a more severe first round. Right at the start Thomas landed a couple of blows on the body which made the champion wince. Both these were caught in the head of the boy who had not Ketchel on three different occasions before. But he made a grievous error by allowing himself to be hooked into a corner. Here Stanley made a quick half start that puzzled the crowd and caused the referee to stop the fight.
