

FISHED FOR THEIR MEALS ON BOAT

Passengers on Steamer Homer Replenish Depleted Store Room.

CRAFT MAKES SLOW PROGRESS FROM FRISCO

Heavy Weather Details Boat on Early Part of Voyage and Then Fog Falls Over Ocean, Compelling Anchoring Off Columbia River.

It took the steamer Homer, Captain Dorris, nine days to make the run from San Francisco including a brief stop at Coos Bay to land a quantity of freight and about a dozen passengers. Terrible head winds and fog are held responsible for the tedious voyage.

The Homer arrived at Couch street dock at 1 o'clock this morning but the passengers remained sound asleep in their berths till the whistle from the factories along the waterfront began to announce that another day had dawned. They had been on board so long that some experienced a feeling of regret when at last they were to see their baggage, perhaps never again to see the little steamer that had brought them safely through one of the hardest blows of the season. A number of them returned later in the day with an English brim pipe, amber mouthpieces, and a tin of cigars in return for the gift to Captain Dorris in return of his ability as a navigator, although his friends say it was a gentle hint to "wake up."

At no time was the steamer in danger, said Captain Dorris in speaking of the trying trip, but she rode in some pretty rough weather. At one time it was blowing a gale from San Francisco to Coos Bay, and the after part of the voyage was counteracted by calm and dense fog to the Columbia river.

NO TROUBLE WITH RAFTS

Three Are Heard From Along Coast During Past Couple of Days.

Log raft towing on the open ocean has been very successful this season and the big piles of logs fastened together on the Columbia river during the winter will soon be at their respective destinations.

Today reports were received from three of the monster rafts. The first of the big rafts which left Astoria last Saturday in tow of the large steamer George C. Foxwick reached San Francisco this morning all well and after an unusually quick run. The tug Hercules, which left the Columbia river about a week ago with one of the Benson Logging company's rafts for San Diego, passed Catalina islands today and should be at the destination in a little while.
