CUT OPENING SALMON VALUE

Alaska Packers Are Selling Reds as Low as \$1.10 in Order to Get Cash.

Wholesale market features: Cutting canned salmon price. Some get market very firm. Output better than last year. Wheat market rather dull. Shift from red to white market. Small offerings. New Oregon crops arrive. Eastern pea crop is short.

Cutting Alaska Salmon Prices. With the opening Alaska prices made but a few days ago, some of the packers have already started to cut quotations from those listed. The cutting is noticeable more on the cheaper grades of Alaska fish than in other lines, but reds and medium reds are not being maintained for recent sales.

Some Cutting on Other Salmon. While reported in a few instances. It is stated that slight concessions in being made in the values on Columbia river chinooks and on Puget sound sockeyes. This week's opening price of one-pound Columbia river falls was the same as last season at \$1.05, but during the past few days several instances are reported where lots were taken by easterners at \$1.00 to \$1.02, mostly the latter figure.

Oregon Onions Are Arriving. Several small shipments of new Oregon onions have been received in the front street markets from the Shore district. The quality is of fine quality with good sizes. Crop reports are very good. Another car of Walla Walla onions was unloaded at 50 cents and found a good average around \$1.25 while the local product sold readily at \$1.50 per hundred pounds.

Butter Men Are Scared. Local conditions justified advance but outside prices are low. The advance of 1/2c a pound in the local creamery butter market during the past week was expected because it was fully justified by local conditions. However, outside conditions are not of the best and some makers put forth the advance in the hope of making a profit for the week.

Poultry Strikes High. New Advanced Values Shown With Better Demand Than Supplies. Poultry market shows high prices during the past week because of the unusually heavy demand. While receipts were a general one, quality was not so good as in previous weeks. The price of the week was sold at 14c and 15c a pound, while broilers and fryers were at 12c and 13c a pound for the live birds.
