CHECK FOR 15 CENTS SHOWS CAREFUL METHODS OF BOOKKEEPING BY ROAD



Chicago, Ill., Aug. 22.—An incident which shows the care with which the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul railway handles accounts in a large corporation was brought to light this week when Jack Durney was asked to endorse the above check. The check was issued eight years ago and covers 15 cents. Durney is wealthy and had long since forgotten the check, but all the time his account has been credited on the books of this concern and immediately upon his return he was asked to endorse it and get the account closed. The trouble all came over a difference of opinion and a glass of beer.

On arrival at the place of employment Durney discovered that the foreman on Flanagan, was an enemy of his. They had worked together in the past at railroad building and each was jealous of the other's skill. Further into the "boss" was a Kerry man, while Durney was a native American. The Kerry and Limerick people never did get along well together, not even at home.

Durney gave the check to Lawler for a drink, but forgot to endorse it. The saloonkeeper put it in the cigar case, where it has lain ever since. In the meantime the St. Paul road has been carrying Durney's name on the payroll because the amount which the company owed him is still on the books.
