To a Portland sawmill was awarded yesterday the contract for sawing the timbers for the largest derrick which has ever been built in the Pacific northwest.

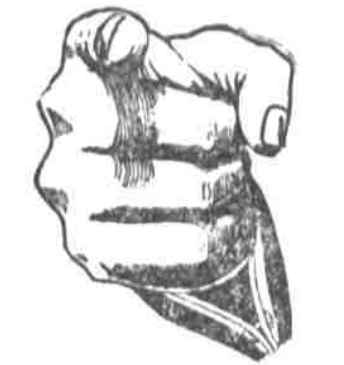
W. G. North, formerly with the Western Realty & Investment company, has opened the Pine Tree Land company at 209 1/2 Broadway building.
