### American Marksman Is Both Born and Made—Hand Him a Gun, and a Little Practice Does the Rest—Congress Waking Up.

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Washington, Aug. 24.—The national marksmanship tournament now in progress at Camp Perry, near Sandusky, Ohio, in which both state and national troops, the marine corps, the navy and the military and naval academies are taking part, marks a new epoch in small arm practice in the United States. Already the champions of the world in marksmanship on land and on sea, with big guns and with small arms, the defenders of the American flag are not content with past achievement, but are seeking to set new marks and to make new records.

### Turkish Mob Wants to Lynch Them—J. B. Ready to Seize the Reins.

Constantinople, Via Plevdiv, Aug. 24.—This city is in a turmoil today, following the arrest of several more of the defaulting officials of the old regime and Grand Vizier Kiamil Pasha is having a hard time to prevent the mob from taking the prisoners forcibly from the jails and killing them. The report that Kiamil is negotiating with the British for the loan of a number of English army officers to reorganize the Turkish army to prevent the radicals from dominating the sultan and precipitating a bloody revolution, has only served to heighten the disorder.

Berlin, Aug. 4.—Frederick Speck von Sternburg, the German ambassador to the United States, died at Heidelberg today following an operation for cancer. He had suffered a long time. The operation was performed on a heroic measure to remove the cancer, which was on his face.

### Five Days in Public Contact Before Case Is Diagnosed.

Washington, Aug. 24.—With religion as his only solace, John R. Early, Spanish war veteran, stricken with leprosy, awaits his fate in an isolated tent on the banks of the Potomac river, where he is constantly kept today by officials in the employ of the health departments. Thousands of people in Washington are frightened because of the possibility that they have contracted the disease through contact with Early, who spent five days in the city, eating in restaurants, riding in street cars and taking in the sights generally.

Wallowa, Or., Aug. 24.—By September 5, if the present rate of progress is maintained by the O. R. & N. track laying crew, the whole of the O. This route when completed will open a rich trade district and will be an important step in the development of Canadian commerce.

## TEACHING BOYS TO SHOOT

A new device has been invented for teaching schoolboys marksmanship without danger to themselves. It is known as the "sub target machine" and its ammunition is used with this contrivance. The boy simply aims the gun and pulls the trigger, and a needle-like rod registers on a miniature target the point where the bullet would have struck on a regulation target had the gun been loaded. This machine is not a toy, but has been adopted by the navy and many military companies, while several thousand are in use in the Oregon army.

## WHERE AMERICA IS LEGGING.

Measured by the standards of other nations there is great need for the encouragement of rifle practice in the United States. We have only 47 organized government clubs, with a membership of only about 3,000. Switzerland, with a population only larger than ours, has 3,658 clubs, with a membership of 23,000. England has 1,200 clubs, with a membership of nearly 50,000. Switzerland spends \$200,000 a year on its clubs and turns over 100,000 rifles, trained marksmen annually. The only thing done to foster rifle practice outside of the military and naval service in the United States is that of the National Rifle association. With this association there are affiliated 21 state rifle associations, 86 trust machine rifle clubs, military organizations, 6 civilian rifle clubs, six college and university shooting organizations and 15 rifle clubs, 146 organizations in all.

## VALUE OF IDAHO PROPERTY.

Boise, Idaho, Aug. 24.—The state board of equalization, which has just finished its labors here, placed the aggregate assessed valuation of all property in the state of Idaho at \$15,000,000. The valuation of railroads over the state was raised over the assessed value of last year, the main line property being placed at \$1,000,000. The increase amounts to about 15 per cent.
