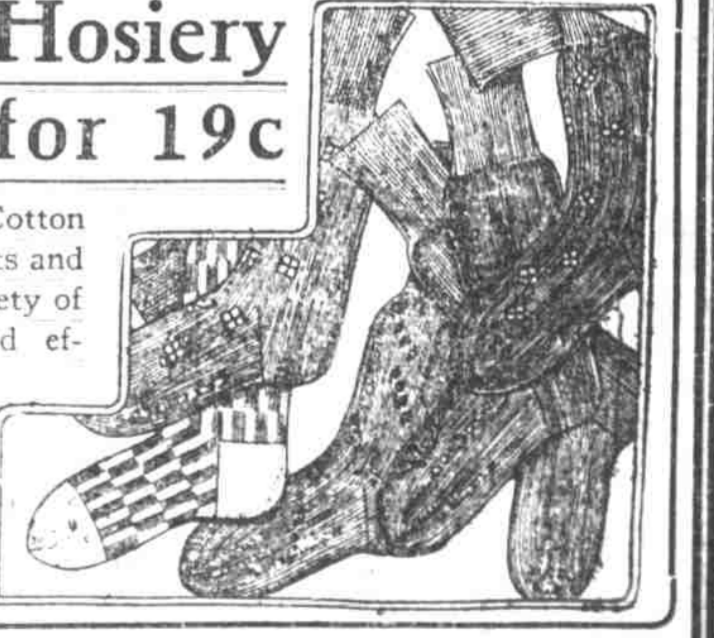

## WORK STARTS ON EATON HALL

(Salem Branch of The Journal)  
Salem, Oct. 27.—Shook & Travlers of Salem were yesterday awarded the contract for the construction of Eaton hall, the new liberal arts building for Willamette university. The ground for the building was broken in

June by E. A. Eaton, of Union, whose generosity made the hall possible. The figure at which the contract was let was \$142,400.  
J. E. Tourtellotte, the architect, of Bozay, Idaho, arrived in Salem yesterday and staked off the grounds today. It is expected that the actual work of excavation will begin Monday. The contractors have 11 months in which to complete the building. The heating contract was also awarded to a Salem firm, the bid being \$23,150.  
The new building, when completed will cost \$165,000. It will not be completed before the opening of the fall term in 1909. It will be located at the south of the capital, adjoining the other buildings on the campus of the university.
