

### BUILDERS BUSY; BUILDING BOOM

#### McMinnville Is Also Enjoying an Influx of Eastern People.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) McMinnville, Or., Aug. 27.—This city is experiencing a building boom and an influx of eastern people. Besides residences, four large buildings are in process of erection. The Mill Condensery, to be built here, is now under way. The engine-house of the plant is completed. The condensery will have a capacity of 1,000 cases per day and will employ 40 persons. A large new eating rink, with a maple floor, is being erected next to the Burns building. The dimensions are 50 by 100. This building was planned for five years before any work had begun. The new music hall for the college is nearing completion. It will be two stories in height. The largest building yet started in the city pavilion, which is being erected in the City Park. It is 75 by 150. There will be a gallery around the inside 15 feet wide. Although many residences have been built, not a house can be found for rent. The McMinnville Planning mill is working one-fourth of a day overtime in order to keep up with its orders.

### MACADAMIZING DALLAS STREET

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Dallas, Or., Aug. 27.—So far this summer seven business blocks have been macadamized in Dallas, with two more in course of completion. Bids for about 15,000 linear feet of sewer have been called for, to cover the greater portion of the city remaining unsewered. The work is to be completed by December 1. The work of macadamizing is being done by the city. Cement walks are being placed on all business streets, and all companies having telegraph and telephone poles are replacing them with new ones. The city has its own rock crusher and roller, and it is expected to macadamize every block in the city within the next two or three years. ### \$15,000 CHURCH AT PENDLETON

Pendleton, Or., Aug. 27.—The Christian church has started to erect a \$15,000 building of stone or concrete blocks to take the place of the building burned here in the recent fire. A larger and more modern building is being destroyed will be erected. Until the new building is completed, the church will use the different churches of the city, the free use of all of which has been tendered.

### SAYS GOOD WORD FOR JAPANESE

#### Mr. Kuma Says Japs in America Are Taught to Be Good Here.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Stockton, Cal., Aug. 27.—The Japanese residents of California gamble away over \$3,000,000 annually. So states T. Kuma, secretary of the Japanese association of America, with headquarters in San Francisco. Mr. Kuma came to Stockton yesterday to confer with the chief of police and the sheriff relative to closing the Chinese gambling dens in this county. "Our people do very little gambling in our own country," says Kuma. "We have strict laws prohibiting gambling and anyone caught at it is severely punished. In China gambling is an institution recognized by law. The Japanese have a great weakness for the Chinese game of fan-tan. They have largely acquired the gambling habit in China and in this country. It is estimated that the Japanese have been spending \$300,000 per year gambling in Fresno alone. Probably much more is squandered in Sacramento and as much here. Fresno and Sacramento have closed their gambling dens. If this county will not close its dens, we want the officers to at least keep all Japanese people out of them. "Our association is working to counteract the strong anti-Japanese sentiment that has arisen on this coast. Our people are a law-abiding, reasoning people. Through our newspapers, our branch associations and religious agencies, we are endeavoring to tell our people what is expected of them by the Americans. We are explaining to them the American conception of morality and the laws of this country governing marriage. The Japanese will comply with your laws if they are made known to them. You haven't the highest type of the Japanese race in California, neither have you the lowest. Our people are like those of any other country; we have good and bad, but the general standard is good." Mr. Kuma is a graduate of Stanford university.

### NEW MOGULS ARRIVE AT CLIFFS, WASH.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Cliffs, Wash., Aug. 27.—Eight of the ten new engines built by the Baldwin Locomotive works of Philadelphia for the Spokane, Portland and Seattle Railway company arrived in Cliffs this morning and will be fitted up here in the roundhouse and put on their regular runs as soon as possible. The other two engines will arrive tomorrow. These mammoth engines are all fitted with the Washburn gear, and all other improvements of the latest type. They were billed through from the factory as weighing one hundred and fifty tons each, the freight bills on all amounted to exactly \$25,000. The large round-house now presents a very busy-like appearance, with the large switch engines that were consigned here some time ago, and the additional eight track engines that arrived this morning.

### BROKER DORR SAYS CREDITORS HASTY

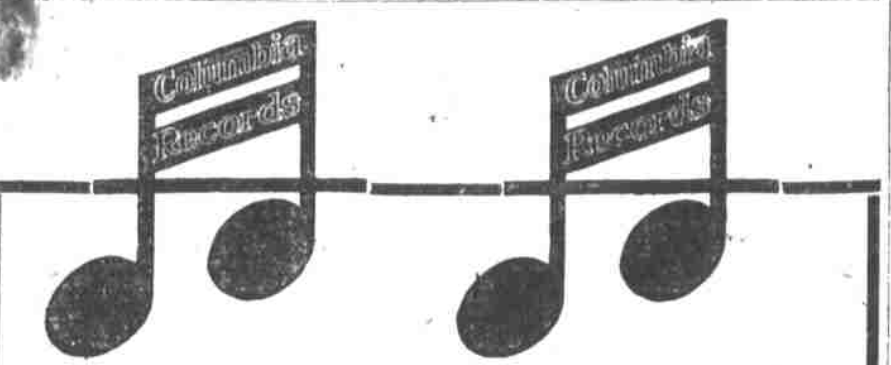

Los Angeles, Cal., Aug. 27.—Blaming his creditors for hasty action precipitating a crisis in his financial affairs, the Broker Fred Dorr is today preparing to start for the east, where he expects to raise money sufficient to settle his claims. Dorr said today that he would be gone about a month and would return in time to appear in court at San Francisco when the case instituted against him by Captain H. H. Norwood is called for trial. "I have no fear as to the outcome of the Norwood case," said Dorr. "There is absolutely nothing to the charges. I have dealt with Captain Norwood, as you have with every one else, perfectly legitimately."

### PORTUGAL FACES WORSE TROUBLES

#### Revolution Menaces Royalty With Bolder Front Than on Day Carlos Died.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Lisbon via the Frontier, Aug. 27.—Believing a widespread revolutionary plot is brewing in Portugal, the government is resorting to secret repressive measures in some respects even more rigorous than those proceeding the

assassination of King Carlos and his son, Crown Prince Luis. The general orders issued to this effect from the royal palace became known through an officer stationed on the frontier at Montalvo. According to the story of this officer young King Manuel is not permitted to stir from the palace except in the midst of a cordon of picked guards. Except for a few regiments of tried loyalty little dependence is placed in the troops and the palace garrison is being constantly reduced by the suspicions of the king's advisers, who fear to keep soldiers in the capital upon whom they cannot depend. The list of trusted men is thus becoming rapidly depleted. The ministers also fear to arouse public outcry by making wholesale arrests of suspected rebels. Should the prisons become stuffed with these, an outbreak would be inevitable. Troops on the frontier are so indifferent to the cause of the government that they are permitting wholesale smuggling of arms into the country.
