An interesting question confronts the Brooklyn Republican and Improvement club, upon which some action will have to be taken at the meeting tonight in the club hall, Milwaukee and Powell streets. This club has been working for the location of the new high bridge at Clay street, connecting with East Mill street, three blocks south of the present location, and has had plans prepared for a high bridge at this point. However, the bond issue of \$100,000 was for a bridge at Madison street, and if the location of the bridge is to be changed, this bond issue will have to be repealed and a new one called for. Whether the club will undertake this large matter, in the face of the action of the United East Side Push club Tuesday night of this week, is the interesting question to be decided tonight.

Starting home with a cargo of wet goods, James Welch, a butcher living in Albina, thoughtlessly stepped in front of a car at Third and First streets last evening. The car was not seriously damaged, but every spectator thought Welch was cut into bits. Being drunk he was not much hurt. When the police learned Welch's true condition he was locked up for the night. This morning, being again able to dodge cars, he was turned loose.

The application of the Southern Pacific company for a permanent order restraining the Oregon railroad commission from enforcing its order with reference to the Harriman interests connecting their tracks with those of the United Railways on the west side will be heard by Judge Gilbert in the United States circuit court Saturday. A temporary restraining order was issued by the court last Tuesday.
