

FATALLY WOUNDS AN UNKNOWN MAN

Otto Harald Fires Into Crowd, but Claims Was Being Robbed.

As the result of a row in the All National saloon, Sunday and Thursday night, an unknown man in St. Vincent's hospital with a bullet wound in his head and liver.

Otto Harald, 45 years old, who said he had been in Portland three weeks, is in the city and charged with assault to murder. He declares he was being robbed when he fired his shots into the crowd in the saloon. William Krausmann is held as a witness. He says he saw Harald in almost every detail.

Just before being under the assault, the wounded man partially regained consciousness, but was unable to give his name. He is unknown in the saloon. City Physician Ziegler said after the operation that his chance for life was small.

Though slightly the worse for drink Harald talked of the shooting. "The man I shot had some money with him. I was with a German from eastern Oregon, and then they came at me. I had \$50 in my pocket, and they got it before I fired. There were five or six of them with their hands on my throat and they were robbing me. That's why I fired. I shot another man in the saloon shot at him, but there is no other evidence that more than Harald's two shots were discharged. One bullet went wide.

Harald tells of an attempted robbery at Pasco where he scared off two thugs with his revolver. He said he was a blacksmith by trade, but since coming to Portland had been doing excavation work for contractors.

OREGON SHORT LINE SUED FOR DAMAGES

(Special Dispatch to the Journal.)
Des Moines, Iowa, Aug. 29.—To recover damages for the death of Charles D. Loomis, who was fatally stabbed by a negro porter while traveling in Idaho, J. P. Reeve, administrator, has brought suit against the Pullman company and the Oregon Short Line Railway company. He asks \$15,000. Loomis died from his wounds three months in the hospital. The petition recites that his two children were also slain by the big knife.

The barometer is rising over this district and falling over Nevada and Utah where a low pressure area is central. A high pressure area of considerable extent is off the north Pacific coast. Light showers have fallen in Washington, western and northeastern Oregon and northern Idaho, but the skies are clearing in most localities. It is slightly warmer in western and southwestern Washington and northwestern Montana but the temperature continues much below the seasonal average over the entire northwest, ranging from 11 to 26 below normal over this forecast district except along the coast and south.
