

EIGHTEEN DROWNED THREE AT DEATH OF SHOPKEEPER FIGHT FOR LIFE ON HIGH TOWER

Thirteen Folsom Victims Identified and Five Others Known to Have Perished—Possibly a Score More May Be Found.

Folsom, N. M., Aug. 29.—The bodies of 13 victims of Thursday night's flood burst have been recovered and identified. Five other persons are positively known to have been drowned and swept away and their bodies are now being searched for. It is claimed by many that anywhere from a dozen to a score of people are still unaccounted for.

The known dead are: Miss Lucy Creighton, 32 years old; Charles Wheeler; Mrs. Wheeler; Billy Wheeler, a week old; Daniel B. Wagner Sr.; Mrs. Daniel Wagner; Miss Daisy Wagner; Thomas Wagner; Mrs. Thomas Wheeler; Lottie Wheeler, 6 years old; Vera Wheeler, 6 years old; Walter Wheeler, 10 years old; Mrs. Mary Rooker, telephone operator; Mrs. Mary Cox; Antonio Sales; Mrs. Antonio Sales; Joseph Guerin; Mrs. Joseph Guerin.

The bodies of all have been recovered except those of Daniel B. Wagner, Mrs. Rooker, Charles Wheeler, Walter Wheeler and a Mexican. It is hoped these may be recovered tomorrow. All of the bodies so far recovered are lying at the city hall, which has been turned into a temporary hospital.

Town Built in a Siltway.

The horror of the Folsom flood grows with each telegram from the south. The stories of the survivors are beginning to drift in. The magnitude of the disaster is just beginning to make itself known. The work of recovering the bodies goes forward under the greatest difficulties. Thirteen bodies have been found, five are known to be missing and these were residents of Folsom and the vicinity. There were many strangers in the town who did not know which way to turn when the flood swept through the narrow streets, and there is no means of telling how many of these were carried away by the 30-foot wall of water which rushed down the narrow canyon. Folsom, which was built in a narrow canyon, a death trap if ever there was one. All Thursday afternoon the rain fell in torrents, and the downfall increased as night settled down upon the town. No such rainfall had ever been known in the section, and the residents of Folsom went to bed as usual, unconscious of the doom that was gathering above the town.

Two Heroines of the Flood.

When the great body of water roared past his ranch, Owens ran to the telephone and, calling up Mrs. S. J. Rooker, the telephone operator at Folsom, warned her that the town was in danger. She might have saved her own life by leaving the building, for she has never realized that the flood was coming at the rate of a runaway express train, but she remembered the people who were in the town and immediately began to warn the town. Before her task was half completed the water surrounded the telephone building and escape was cut off.

When the 30-foot wall struck the main street, Mrs. Rooker was still vainly trying to arouse the rest of the town and the telephone building was one of the first to be swept away, carrying the brave woman to her death. Her body was water-struck in the main street from Folsom, with the telephone receiver still strapped to her head.

SCHOOL CENSUS SHOWS INCREASE

Olympia, Wash., Aug. 29.—Nearly completed school census returns indicate a population of about 250,000 children of school age in the state, an increase of 10,000 during the year. The returns show approximately 2,850 school houses in the state valued at about \$15,000,000, representing a gain in value of \$2,000,000. The school districts paid out for education during the year \$7,200,000 or slightly in excess of \$61 per capita on the average daily attendance.
