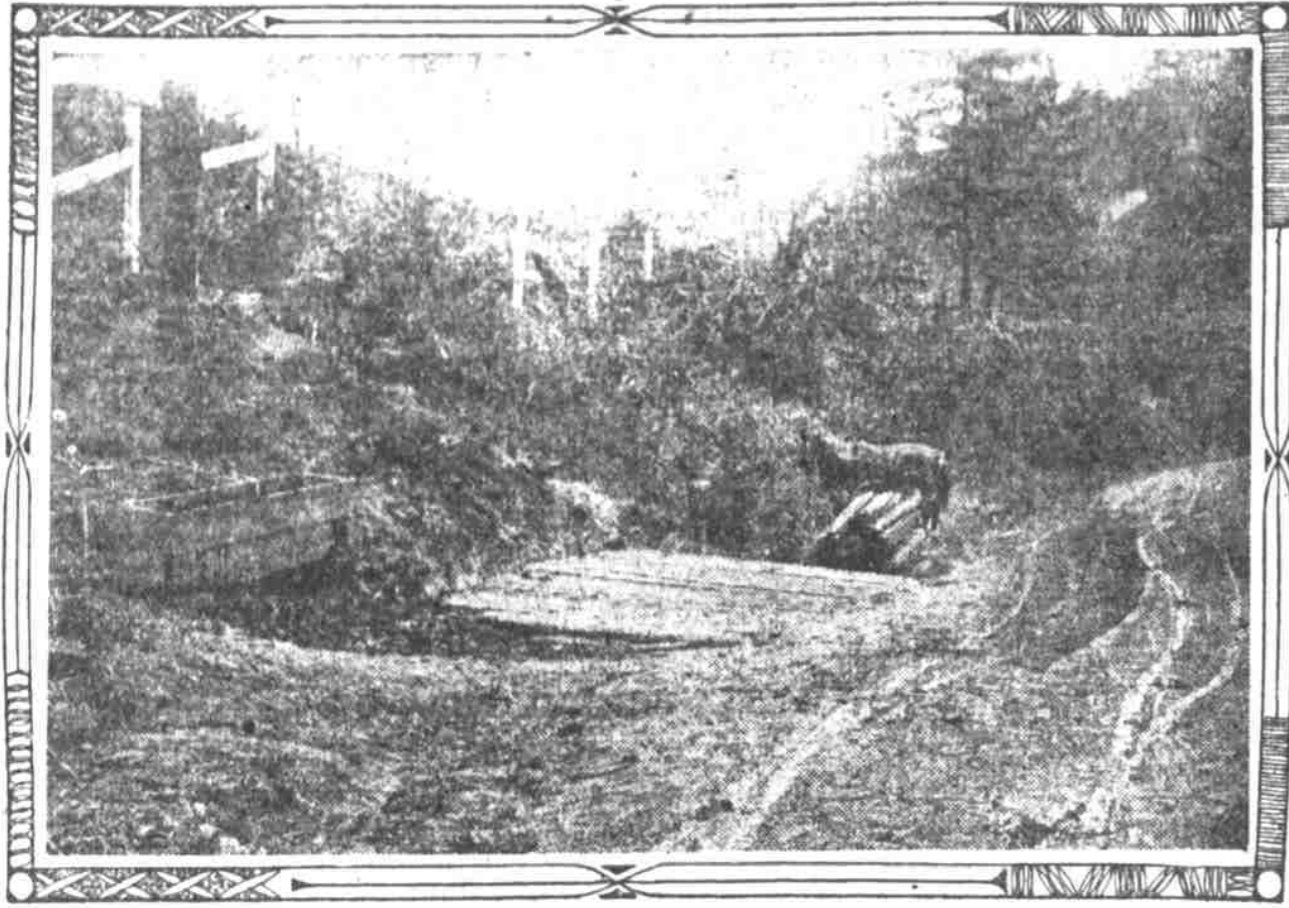


NEW TROUGH CAUSE OF REJOICING BRAZIL'S SHIP NOT FOR JAPAN

Her Dreadnaughts for Herself Alone, and to Whale Argentina.

(Hearst News by Longest Leased Wire.) Washington, Aug. 29.—An explicit conflict between Brazil and Argentina is probable according to advices received almost daily by the state department. Spencer Eddy, American minister to Argentina, has called the state department that the Argentina chamber of deputies has voted a credit of \$4,000,000 for armaments. Argentina is in a market to buy warships and any country having such for sale can find a cash purchaser. Plans for building war vessels are to be rushed by Argentina and both the naval and army force is to be strengthened at once. Argentina officials say the building by Brazil of these powerful warships is a step preparatory to the coming conflict. The new ships are part of the armament desired by Brazil and other countries are probably correct. Much excitement was created here by the report that the ships were being built by Brazil for the Japanese navy. Naval authorities here have been watching Brazil with much interest. They were at a loss to understand what Brazil could want with a powerful navy. Argentina's warlike talk and move offers an explanation.

STRONG ARGUMENTS RAISED FOR BUILDING NEW BRIDGE ON MADISON

Investigation prepared for The Journal by Walter Herrin and E. A. Haid, with the following reasons are given why the Madison street bridge should not be removed from Madison street and Hawthorne avenue to Clay street and East Mill street.

According to the report of J. R. C. the known consulting engineer, and of the Kinney Taylor, it has been shown that a new steel bridge 60 feet in width can be constructed from Madison street on the west side to Hawthorne avenue on the east side for a total cost of \$1,000,000, the amount of bonds raised by the taxpayers of the city of Portland therefore that said

bridge can be built some 25 feet higher than the present structure, which will enable practically all of the river boats to pass under the same without opening the draw at the ordinary stages of water. The structure on the east approach of said bridge, so as to cover the tracks of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company, the Southern Pacific company and the O. R. & N. company.

Greater Cost Encountered. No structure has yet been furnished for the construction of the proposed high bridge from Clay street on the east side to East Mill on the east side. The estimate made by Engineer Lockwood of a like structure from Madison to Hawthorne or from Jefferson to Hawthorne, it would appear that the bridge proposed for the latter site would cost in the neighborhood of \$1,000,000.
