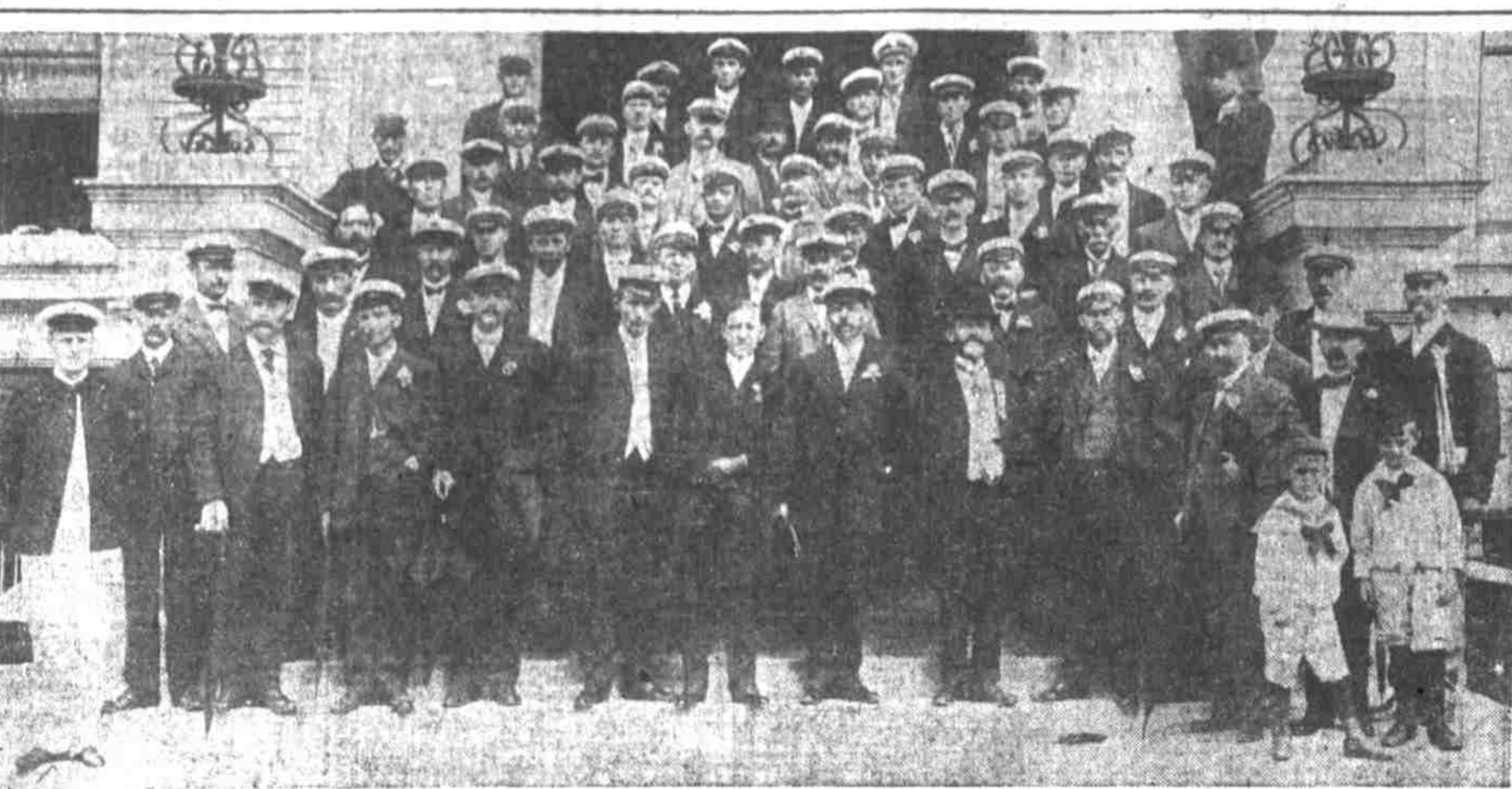

FOUR JOIN IN PORT FLEET

Two Windjammers and Two Tramp Steamers Arrive in Harbor.

Two sailing vessels and two large tramp steamers have arrived in the harbor since Saturday, the sailing vessels carrying general cargo from Europe and the steamers coming in ballast to carry away wheat.

The windjammers are the French bark Gael, the British ship Aberfoyle. The Gael came into Columbia dock No. 1 this morning where she will deliver about 3,000 tons of general cargo.

The Gael made the run from London to Portland in 133 days and it took the Aberfoyle 182 days to make the same run from Antwerp. The captain of the Gael reports having encountered heavy winds in the vicinity of Cape Horn.

WAS MASTER OF GLENMORAG

Captain Currie of the Queen Amelle Sailed Noted Wreck.

Captain A. Currie, master of the British steamship Queen Amelle, which sailed for Europe last night from Bremerton to carry wheat to Europe, has been here twice before under rather extraordinary circumstances.

The first time he arrived here was after having lost the ship in a heavy fog off the coast of the Columbia. The lives were lost in that awful wreck, the ponderous hull of the vessel having struck the beach and broken in two.

RIVER STEAMER SINKS

Laden With Railway Construction Equipment; Hits Rock.

Pelone Rupert, B. C., Aug. 31.—The big stern wheel river steamer Caladonia, owned by Foley, Welch & Stewart, the Grand Trunk Pacific railway contractor, which left here early last morning on a voyage to England, struck a rock in the Skeena river when 20 miles above Port Irving and went to the bottom.

TELEPHONE IN RATE WAR

Seattle, Wash., Aug. 31.—The steamer Telephone, now at Portland, is rumored to be the boat acquired by the Port Blakeley Mill company for the Bellingham run in opposition to the Canadian Pacific.

LEONA IN COMMISSION

Begins Regular Service Between Portland and McMinnville.

McMinnville, Or., Aug. 31.—The steamer Leona of Portland began making regular trips between McMinnville and Portland this morning. She leaves here at 8 a. m. The craft is owned by H. Marshall and Fred Brauer.

ITALIAN CRUISER ARRIVES

Puglia Will Be at Anchorage at 4:30 O'Clock This Afternoon.

The Italian cruiser Puglia will be in the harbor this afternoon at 4:30 o'clock. The Puglia arrived in Astoria early this morning from Puget sound and proceeded up the river without delay on her way out.

I sprayed three times with arsenate of lead and I believe have killed the last worm. I will pay anyone \$1 for every wormy apple they can find on any of my trees.
