Threats of lynching were freely made and the sheriff, hearing an attack upon the jail, spirited the trio away early this morning and placed them in the prison at Clayton...

ONE CONVENTION, TWO CHAIRMEN

San Francisco County Republicans Will Assemble Tonight.

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, Sept. 1.—Two chairmen will call the San Francisco county Republican convention to order to-night when the delegates assemble in Walton's pavilion. Bert Dam, the Lincoln-Roosevelt leaguer, and Harry Worthington, the "regular," are the contending chairmen. Each insists that he has the right as chairman of the county committee to call the convention to order. The fourth party committee has been organized by a coup effected by the organization Republicans. The convention is to name a committee on credentials and meet again next week to make nominations. There are 18 assemblies to be nominated and the eyes of the Republicans all over the state are focused on this convention, as the San Francisco delegation usually controls the state legislature. The convention will also name four candidates for state senator. The fourth congressional district convention is to meet tomorrow night to renominate Julius Kahn, who has already pledged the delegates to the convention...

SPOKANE FIRM LOWEST.

REINSURANCE ADVANCES.

Fifty Per Cent is Now Quoted on British Steamer Aeon. Re-insurance on the British steamer Aeon from this port for Australia has advanced to 50 per cent. She is now out 15 days from this port as it ordinarily takes to make the voyage. It is feared that even if the steamer is afloat, perhaps drifting about with a broken propeller, she will run on provisions shortly. Besides her European officers she carried a mixed crew, consisting largely of Chinese.

ALONG THE WATERFRONT.

The steamer George W. Elder is due to arrive here this afternoon from San Pedro and will arrive at the dock at Martin's dock at 8 o'clock. The steamer State of California, Captain Knapner, reached Alsworth dock last night from San Francisco bringing a capacity list of passengers. Lightship No. 47, which has been undergoing repairs at Astoria, will go back to her station at Umattila reef this afternoon, according to an announcement made by Superintendent Hart of the lighthouse service this morning. The tender Heather goes to Grays Harbor with supplies for stations there. A bill of sale was filed in the Astoria court today for the tugboat Tongue Point Lumber company sells the steamer Lottie to the Hammond German-owned Alastia company. The consideration named is \$10.

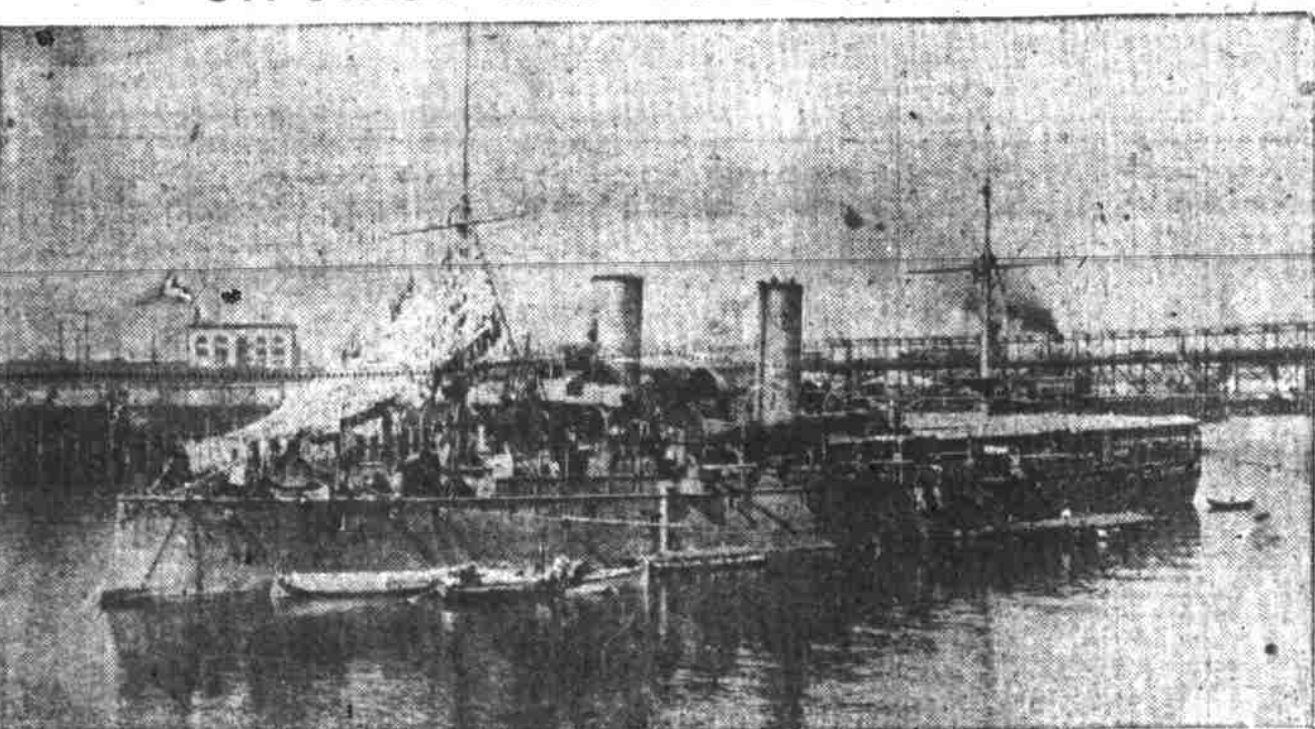

ITALIAN CRUISER IN PORTLAND'S HARBOR ON FIRST TRIP TO PACIFIC NORTHWEST



Italian Cruiser Puglia at Anchor in Portland Harbor.

With 18 officers and 275 men on board the Italian cruiser Puglia, Commander Cusani-Visconti, is at anchor in Portland's harbor a short distance above the steel bridge. Pilot Harry Emken anchored her there at 6 o'clock last night after a smart run up the river. The visiting warship is painted a somber gray and does not make much of a striking picture in the distance. But on board everything is trim and neat. The sailors are typical Italians, most of them having seen considerable service in foreign wars. From here the Puglia will speed across the Pacific to Hongkong after having undergone extensive repairs to her machinery. When the Puglia entered the harbor yesterday afternoon she was met by a launch carrying Italian Consul Candioli and other prominent Italian residents of Portland, acting as a committee of reception on the part of the Italian colony. They gave the officers of the cruiser and the entire crew their heartiest welcome and said everything would be made as pleasant as possible during the visit. Commander Cusani-Visconti replied that he had heard much of Portland and had arranged to remain here till September 24. On September 20, Italy's natal day, there will be a program including a reception to the officers of the cruiser at the residence of the consul. The vessel's armament consists of four 5.9-inch guns, one 2.9-inch eight 2-inch, eight 3.4-inch and two 3.6-inch. She also has two torpedo tubes. Her bunker capacity is 550 tons speed 22 knots, displacement 2,484 tons and engines develop 7,900 horsepower. In addition to Commander Cusani, the cruiser's officers are: Captain, Augusto de Brandis; Lieutenants Guido Cullolo, Massimo Bernaroli, Giuseppe Glavotto, Eduardo Comito, Gabriele Ratti; Second Lieutenant Gustavo Gaidini; Engineer Ivo Casola; Assistant Engineer Federico Caldeffi and Vincenzo Ceccari; Surgeon Adolpho Farese; Commissary Arturo Drotton.

WILL KEEP ALL PARTY PROMISES

Bryan Makes the Dodge Personal, Addressing Dakotans. (United Press Leased Wire.) Fargo, N. D., Sept. 1.—W. J. Bryan, in a speech at the fair grounds today, promised personally to see that the pledges of the Democratic platform were fulfilled. He declared if he was elected he would call an extra session of congress at once and would proceed without delay to put into operation the Democratic proposals for meeting present conditions in this country. Bryan arrived here at 7 o'clock this morning and was met at the station by the Bryan and Kern club of Fargo. He was given a cheering ovation and after breakfast the parade passed through the streets to the fair grounds. There Bryan held a reception, shaking hands with the citizens for two hours. At noon he was the guest of honor at a dinner given by the leaders of the party in this section. After his address he left immediately for Grand Forks, where he will speak this evening. Late tonight the Bryan party will arrive at Sioux City, Iowa, and it is expected the candidate will deliver an address there.

INQUIRY OPENS ON CRUISER COLORADO
