Judge Gantenbein in the circuit court yesterday granted the petition of Mrs. Louise H. Boise for permission to have an expert examine the books and accounts of the Hawthorne estate. Her husband, Whitney L. Boise, is accused by her sister, Mrs. E. J. Collins, of embezzling \$115,000 belonging to the estate, and Mrs. Boise, as one of the directors, claims the right to have the books examined. Judge Gantenbein suggested that the two sisters try to agree on the choice of an accountant. If they fail to do so, the court will make the appointment. The court's order applies only to records in custody of the estate, and some of the papers that Mrs. Boise demands the right to see could not be reached in the proceeding.

The first regular monthly meeting of the Audubon society for the fall and winter season was held in the society's quarters at the city hall last night. W. L. Finley and H. T. Bohman, who have just returned from the Malheur and Klamath lakes investigating the bird life of that region, submitted a report of their findings. Messrs. Finley and Bohman reported that the white heron and the grebe, once so plentiful in the lakes, had been exterminated. Only two herons being seen on the trip. The grebe on Tule and Klamath lakes were found to have been killed in large numbers. Following the reading of this report, the usual routine business was transacted.

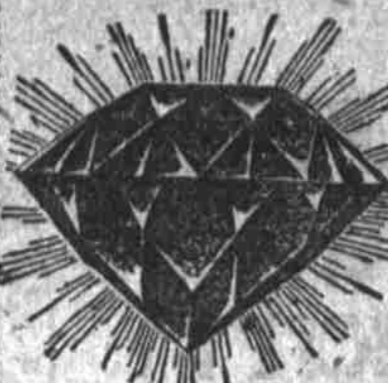

WINDOW FULL OF PEACHES ATTRACTS MUCH ATTENTION

Just 8,440 peaches it took to fill up the big show window of Ode, Wortman & King's store on Fifth street. The miniature horticultural exhibit was placed in the show window of the Portland store by the Lewiston Land & Irrigation company. The peaches, which are the largest of their kind ever seen here, came from the company's orchard in Clarkston, Wash., and were brought

to the Rose City to advertise the irrigation project at that place. There were exactly 65 boxes of the fruit and in each box are 16 large peaches. The boxes are 10 inches deep and 14 inches wide and 24 inches long, so it takes 66 great big peaches to fill one of them. The pretty feature of the display is the uniform size and color of the luscious fruit. The exhibition drew thousands of interested spectators to the corner of Fifth and Washington streets yesterday afternoon.
