

CELEBRATION OF NEGRO MASONS

African Branch Founded by Prince Hall in Revolutionary Times.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Boston, Mass., Sept. 10.—A four-day celebration was inaugurated in Boston today in observance of the centennial anniversary of the institution of the first grand lodge of colored Masons in America.

Through the first grand lodge of Negro Masons dates from 1808 there were subordinate lodges among the negro residents of Boston in 1784.

On March 6, 1784, he asked the grand lodge of England for a warrant of constitution. The warrant was granted September 25, 1784.

In 1787, Captain James Scott, who married the sister of the celebrated John Hancock, was requested by Prince Hall to bring the warrant for an African lodge back with him.

The lodge of negroes celebrated with great pomp and ceremony the arrival of its warrant from England on December 27, 1787.

The organization of the first lodge was followed by the formation of two other lodges of negro Masons. In 1800 the three lodges joined in forming "African grand lodge," of Boston—subsequently styled the Prince Hall grand lodge of Massachusetts.
