

FISHERMEN MUST GO TO COURT TO GET CLAIMS SAFE ENOUGH

Governor Chamberlain Very Quietly Turns Down Governor Mead's Request to Suspend Statutes Pending Adjudication.

(Called Press Lined Wire.)

Salem, Or., Sept. 12.—Governor Albert E. Mead of Washington today asked Governor Chamberlain to advise Master Fish Warden McAllister to make only one arrest on the Washington side of the Columbia for the purpose of testing the new fish acts, but Governor Chamberlain has refused absolutely to interfere with the master fish warden. The Oregon supreme court has decided that the constitution of Oregon, as approved by congress, gives this state concurrent jurisdiction over the Columbia river and the Snake river, and thereby given the master fish warden authority to enforce Oregon fish laws anywhere on the Columbia river.
