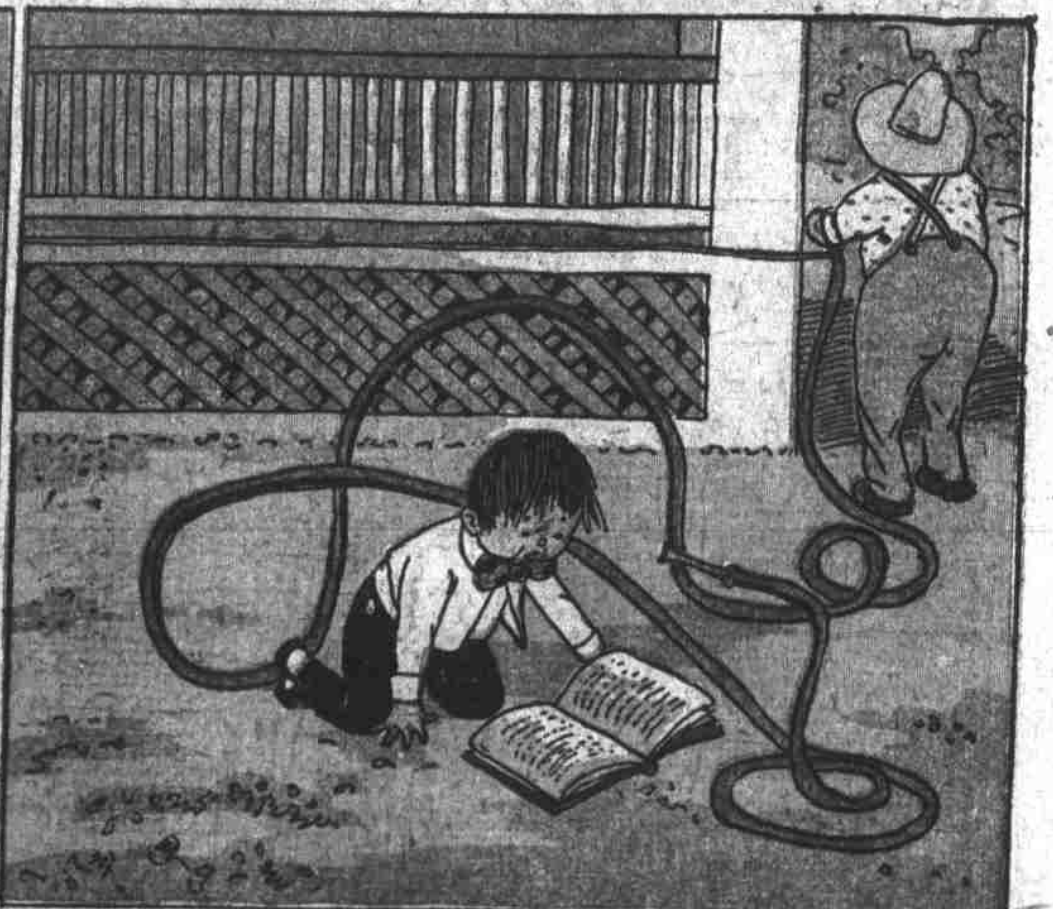
TED'S OBJECT SPELLING LESSON---H-O-S-E AND W-A-T-E-R



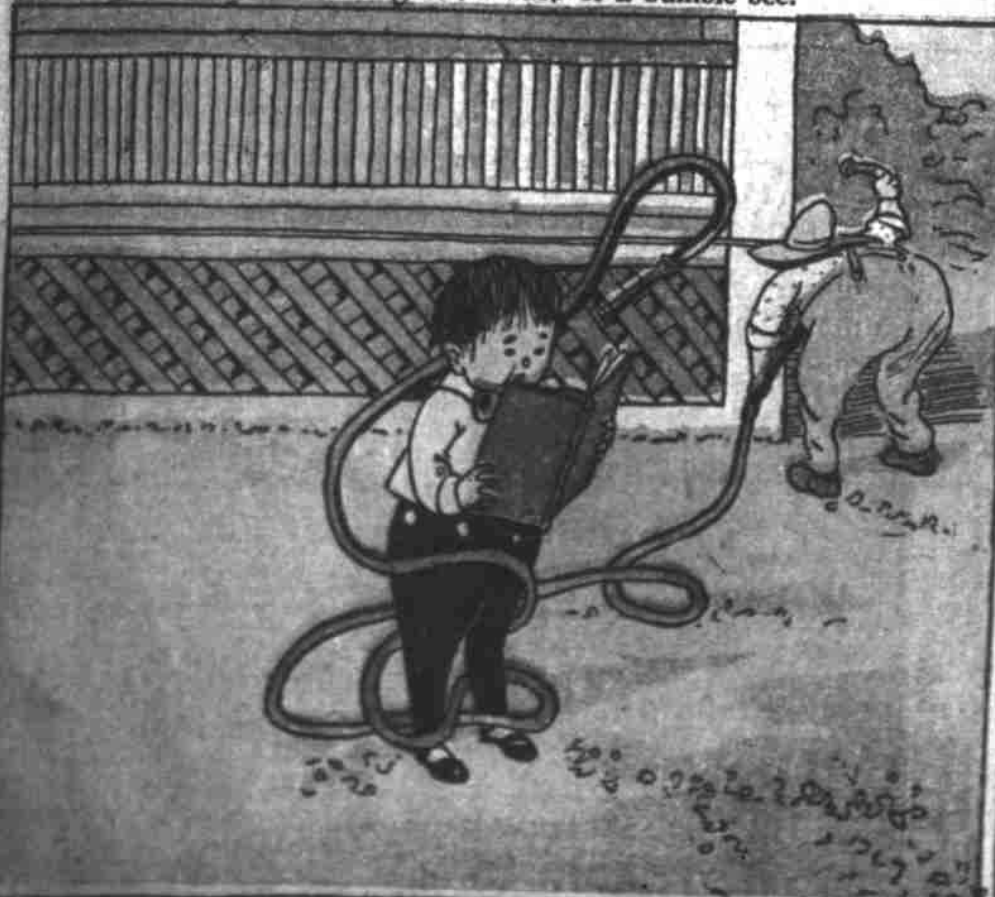
"Well, now, this word is new to me; there, 'tis H-O-S-E. I hope it is not a big rat, a wasp or a bumble bee."



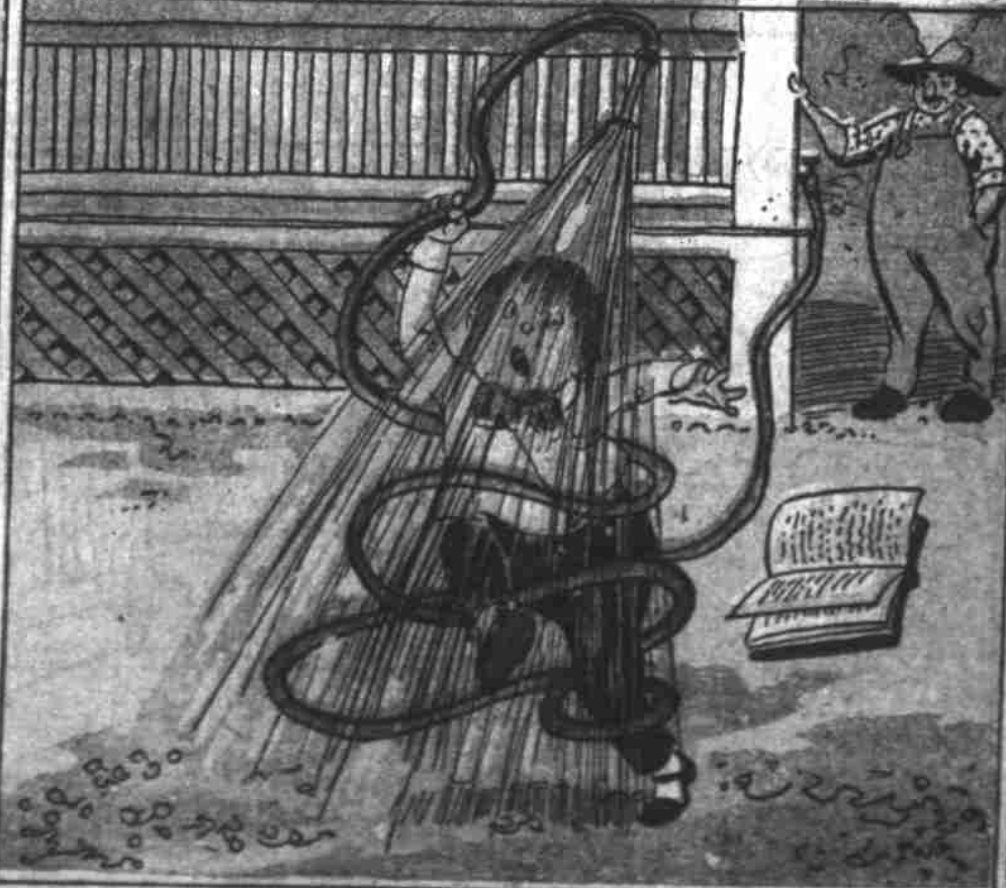
"No; it is not, and I'm glad, coz wasps and bees do sting. It is a hose, a garden hose. Just see the wiggly thing."
