LEGAL WHEELS BEGIN TO GRIND

Conflicting Columbia River Laws Start Inevitable Test Cases.

Mack and Water Bailiff Settem arrested Emil Finne, Matt Berkland and Albert Skog, gillnetters, for fishing with gillnets that exceeded the size allowed by the law.

He will also file complaints against the owners of 10 fish traps located along Tongue point.

After receiving attention at the hospital, she practically recovered from the effects of the drug and her condition is not serious. She could not remember where she engaged the automobile and could give but little description of either it or the chauffeur.

STEWART TAKES PRACTICE RIDE

Comes Off 15-Mile Circle Without a Single Sore Bone in His Body.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Hunchuan, Ariz., Sept. 12.—Colonel William F. Stewart, the "American Dreyfus," the Fort Grant exile, is in the pink of condition today for the 90-mile ride prescribed for him by the war department. He has just made a 15-mile preliminary jaunt last night.

Accompanied by Major Foster, an attaché of the post, Colonel Stewart mounted his horse at Fort Huachuca and dashed across the country. An hour and twenty-six minutes later he drew rein at the fort, having made the round trip of 15 miles.

Friends of Colonel Stewart were delighted today when they learned of the outcome of the ride. They do not hesitate to express their belief that he will have no trouble in passing the 90-mile test and are ready to wager that his horse will finish in better condition than the mount of any other officer riding under similar conditions.

YENNEY FUNERAL AT WALLA WALLA

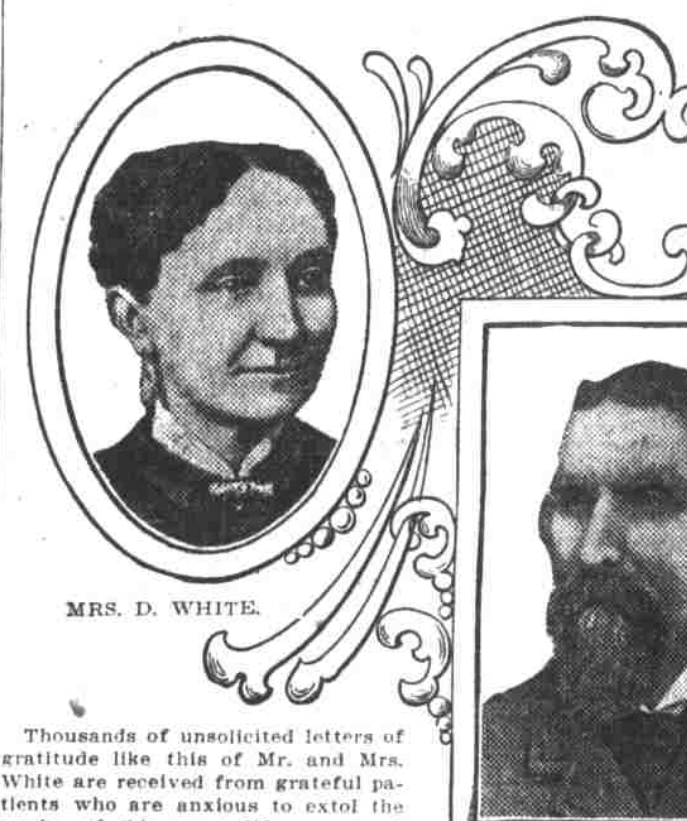
