Logan, attended the meeting of the Federated Trades council, where they met Mrs. Millie R. Trumbull and Dr. T. L. Elliot, representing the supporters of the child labor commission. Protest had been made against the operation of the Pollard children upon a Portland stage as opposed to the state child labor law, and the Federated Trades council had practically decided to oppose the operation of the company here.
