FIRE IN TUNNEL COSTS TWO LIVES (United Press Leased Wire.) Detroit, Sept. 15.—It is believed today that more bodies may be recovered from the new tunnel under the river here, in which a fire last night is known to have cost two lives. More than 200 workmen were in the tunnel when the fire broke out and several were overcome. Had the accident not occurred at midnight, while about one third of the force was at lunch, the list of fatalities would probably have been much greater.

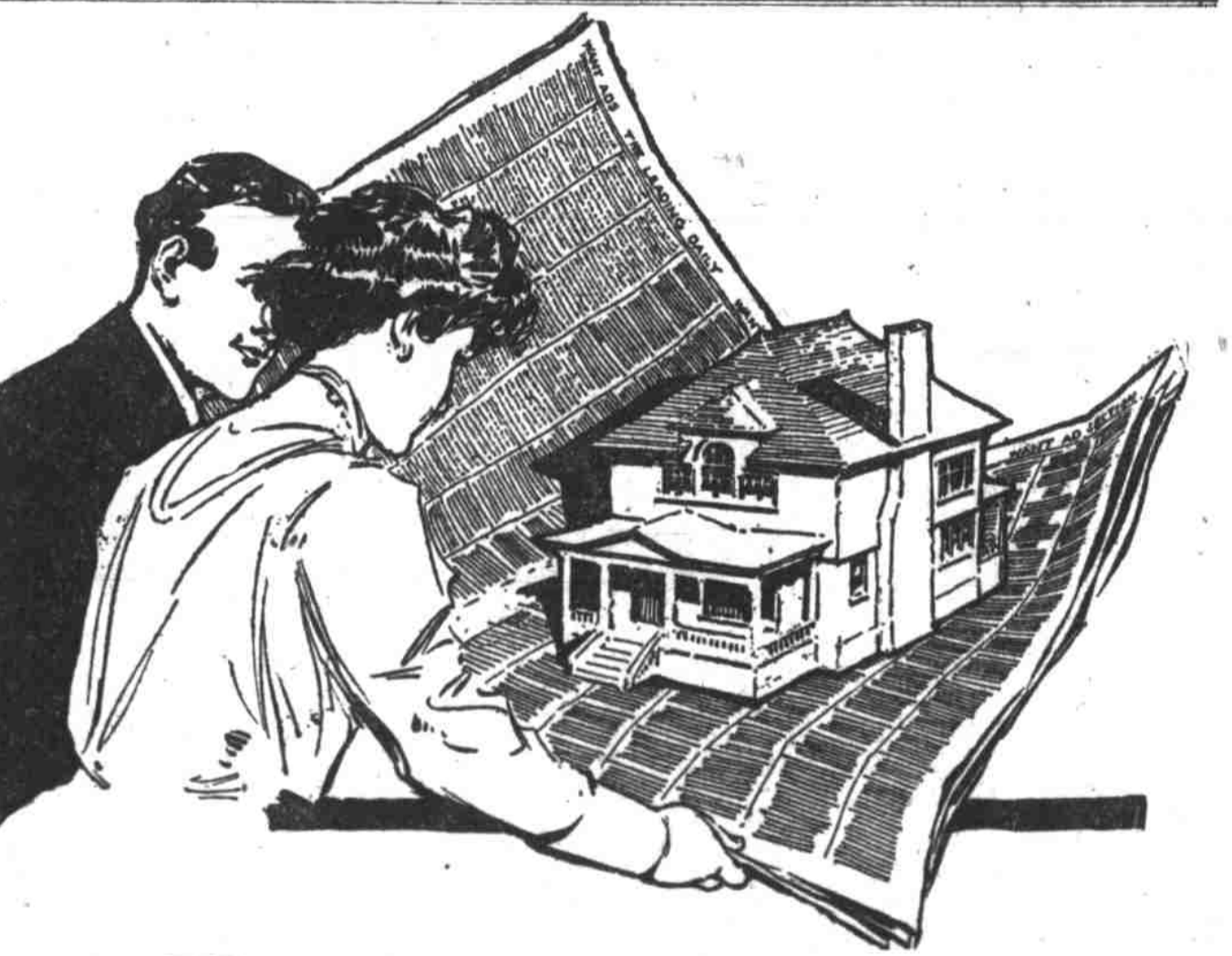
