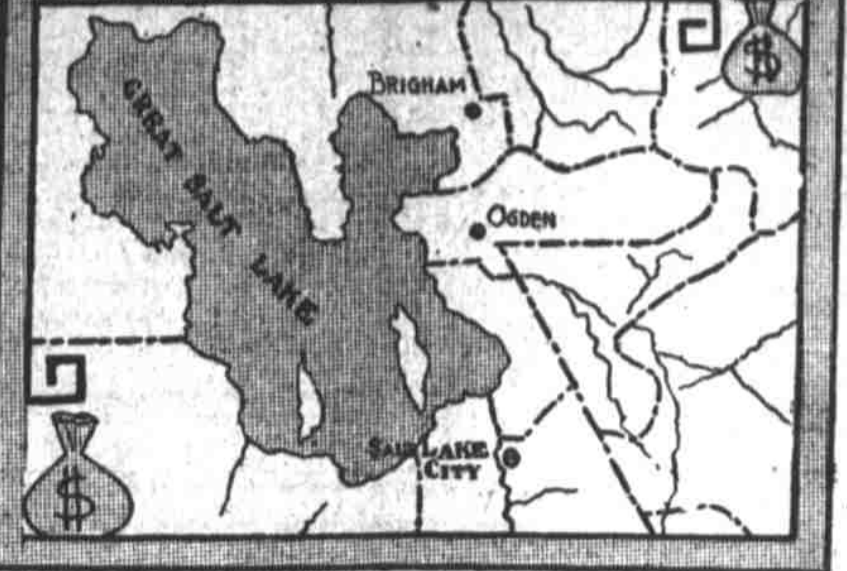

San Francisco Decides to Join State in Alaska-Yukon Exhibit.

San Francisco, Sept. 15.—Chairman Arthur R. Briggs of the local executive committee of the Alaska-Yukon Commercial exposition to be held at Seattle, is today preparing a mass of literature to be sent to the exhibitors, urging all sections to make ready for the exhibition of California. The literature is accompanied by a request for funds and it is the intention of the committee to make as large a display at the Seattle fair as possible.



America's Dead Sea, Which Contains 17,560,338, 200,000 Pounds of Salt and 1,568,160,000 Pounds of Sulphide of Soda.

Salt Lake, Utah, Sept. 12.—Utah is beginning to appreciate the immense value of her salt lake. The Chicago Inter Ocean is authority for the statement that the great Salt Lake now contains 8,780,160,000 tons of salt and 784,080,000 tons of sulphide of soda. The magnitude of the figures indicated is hard to grasp. For example, take the salt alone. The estimated number of pounds would approximate 17,560,338,200. Salt wholesales at \$4 per ton. Each barrel contains 100 pounds. It is a brief mathematical operation which discloses the fact that the monetary value of the salt in the lake is \$703,293,328.00. Last year the total wheat crop of the United States was estimated at \$500,000,000. It is therefore 35 times greater than the total wheat crop of the United States.

END OF STANFORD CONTROVERSY NEAR

Stanford University, Cal. Sept. 15.—The end of the faculty-student fight that has disrupted Stanford University for the past four years is in sight and the students have won the battle for recognition, although the faculty has disavowed any intention to give in to the student body.

SUCCESSFUL TEACHERS RECEIVE CERTIFICATES AND DIPLOMAS

Salem, Sept. 15.—State certificates and diplomas have been issued to 62 successful applicants of the recent examination by State Superintendent J. H. Ackerman. Two hundred and seventy teachers entered the examination, 199 for their first or second trial, as the law gives three trials in which an applicant may complete the examination. Eighteen diplomas were issued for life, 44 certificates valid for five years, 13 more were successful in securing the necessary grades, and papers will be issued when these have had the necessary teaching experience. The total number of successful applicants is 2,570. Following are the successful applicants:
