

FISHING STOPPED

Cannery Owners and Fishermen Along Columbia Will Wait for United States Supreme Court Decision on Oregon's New Law.

The worried frown that has been seen on Master Fish Warden McAllister's forehead ever since the close season for fishing began was displaced today in favor of a smile of peace.

The transition from frown to smile is due to the fact that the reports of the deputies who are patrolling the waters of the Columbia last night assured their chief that there would be practically no further opposition to the enforcement of the laws by Oregon's officials.

The vigorous and impartial tactics of the patrolmen acting under instructions from Warden McAllister have had the effect of stopping all illegal fishing. The fishermen prefer to wait until the supreme court of the United States has passed upon the validity of the Nelson decision made by the Oregon supreme court to taking the chance of having to pay large fines.

Meanwhile Assistant Attorney General Knickerbocker of Seattle and MacDonald of Spokane are preparing data from two circuit court cases which decided the Oregon laws invalid, and upon this data they will base their request for an injunction from the federal court prohibiting Warden McAllister from enforcing the Oregon laws in Washington waters until after the Nelson case has been passed upon by the supreme court. The attorney general of Washington will at once appeal the mooted decision of the Oregon court to the highest tribunal in the country.

F. A. Soufert, the canneryman of The Dalles, from whom Mr. McAllister confiscated a carload of salmon this week, was in Portland last night. He told the warden that he has ceased fishing.

EQUAL SUFFRAGE PETITION FILED

Two years before the issue comes to the ballot the equal suffrage amendment is again an active issue before the people of the state. Yesterday afternoon Mrs. Abigail Scott Duniway and Miss Myrtle E. Pease filed the petition putting the amendment before the voters with the secretary of state at Salem. Attached to the petition were 5,847 signatures. The number required under the law is 4,417. It is also required in the law that the petition must be filed not less than four months before election day. That day will be the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1910.

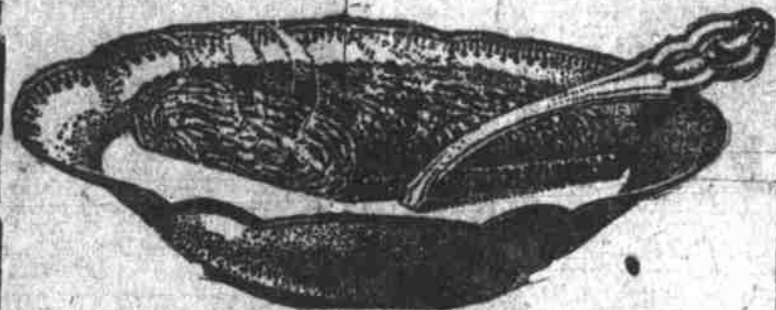
Quite a change has been made in the petition filed at this time and those upon which Mrs. Duniway has gone before the people prior to this time. Provisionally the equal suffrage advocates have asked that women be given the ballot in Oregon on the same condition as men. The new petition, however, asks that all women who are taxpayers in the state shall not be deprived of the right to vote. It is expected that the new issue will meet with the favor of the voters. The change is made so that the women advocates of the change can gain a foothold, according to Mrs. Duniway. An active campaign will be carried on during the two years and the leaders of the movement have high hopes that they will be triumphant at the next trial.

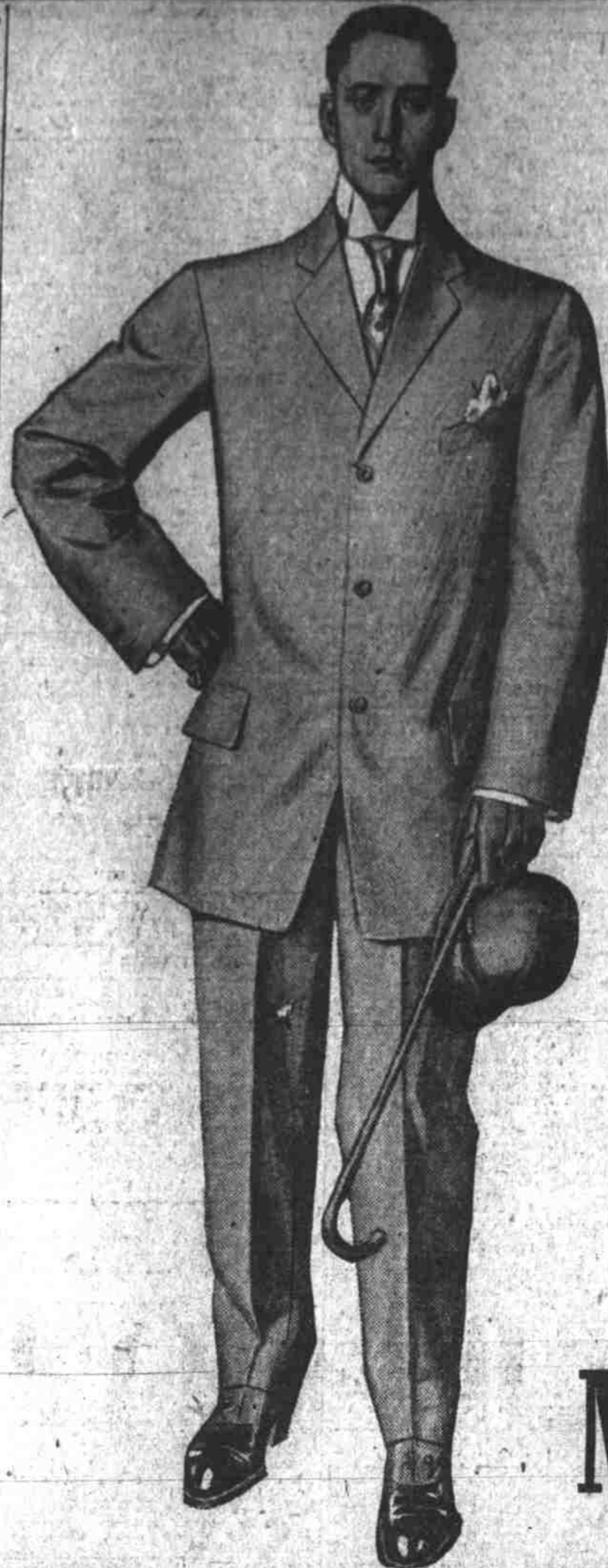
