Airs. Grabow, who was shot in the head three times, is dying. Smith is charged with having gone to the Grabow home and to have attacked the mother and is-year-old daughter. The news of the attack on the woman and girl spread rapidly and when Sheriff Dwinnell went to the house, Smith was waiting for him and fired from a window. The sheriff fell and is in a serious condition.

The shooting of Sheriff Dwinnell aroused the whole community and a posse formed and started for the house, Smith in the meantime had barricaded the house, closed all the windows and doors and by the rapid use of his rifle defied arrest. Whenever the posse came into sight he fired and the men soon resilzed that it would be impossible to capture him during the night without several persons being killed. At daylight, however, the posse surrounded the house and by a sudden dash closed in on Smith. When he saw he would be killed, he surrendered.

The posse found Mrs. Grabow unconscious and there is no hope whatever for her. The little girl was given attention and it is believed she will recover.

WEATHER REPORT

A widespread low barometer area covers the British northwest and the pressure is slightly below normal from the Mississippi river westward, and slightly above normal over the eastern portion of the country. The tropical storm mentioned yesterday over the Gulf of Mexico containues in that region this morning, but with somewhat diminished intensity. Rain has fallen in the eastern portions of Oregon and Washington, in northern idaho and Montans and heavy rains continue along the gulf coast. No material changes in temperature have occurred except in the upper Ohio valley and lower lake region, where it is much warmer. The temperature is slightly below the seasonal average from the Rocky mountains and west gulf coast westward, while it is unseasonably warm over the Missouri and upper Mississippi valleys and the western portion of the Great Lakes.

The indications are for fair weather tonight and Sunday throughout this district, except in western. Washington, where showers are probable tonight. There will be no material change in temperature.
