ASKS TO CUT OUT 6 ITEMS

Heirs of Thomas Wood Estate Believe Administrator Has Made Excessive Charges—Let Taxes Remain Unpaid on Realty.

Emma Ruckert Stevens, daughter of the late Thomas A. Wood, and C. E. Wood, a son, yesterday filed in the circuit court a motion asking Judge Webster to disallow six items in the final account of A. N. Gambrell, the administrator of the estate.

Their objections are based on alleged unnecessary charges made by the administrator in collecting on some of the claims of W. Hosea Wood, another son of the deceased.

Wood dealt extensively in pension claims and had troubles with the United States and with the Oregon authorities over his fees, large amounts that he claimed being disallowed. He was convicted of irregularities in procuring claims before the department of the interior, and Administrator Gambrell in his final report referred to the payment of \$3,500 in collecting on some of these claims, owing to prejudice in the pension department at Washington.

Notwithstanding these difficulties, Gambrell finally collected the greater part of the claims. Because of the difficulty he made an extra charge of \$250 for extra services. This is objected to on the ground that the administrator negligently allowed the taxes to remain unpaid on the estate for the last year, and that he made fair sums out of the pension claims as a partner of W. Hosea Wood.

Commissions of \$400 paid to W. Hosea Wood are declared to have been unnecessary and unauthorized. A purported payment of \$3,500 to the Home Builders is asserted to have been in fact paid to W. Hosea Wood by reason of the purchase of the Home Builders stock by the latter, the objectors alleging that there was at the time enough money on hand to pay off the claims of the Home Builders.

Further objection is made to the payment of \$158.33 cash balance to W. Hosea Wood for his services. It being alleged that he in fact owes the estate, instead of the estate being indebted to him.
