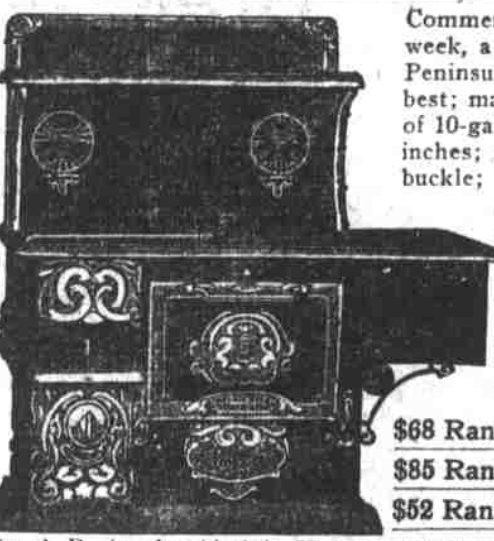

## MINISTERS HEAR PLAIN TALK ON UNIONISM

J. L. Ledwidge Makes Favorable Impression in Speech Before the Ministerial Association—Chances Favorable for Settlement Y. M. C. A. Trouble.

About 75 of Portland's ministers heard some plain talking yesterday afternoon. They left a special meeting, called to hear what some representatives of labor had to say, with more practical knowledge of the laboring class and how to make the church a force among them than they had ever dreamed of. They were told that labor wanted a practical demonstration of the church's friendliness, not mere glowing promises of a coming heaven; that it wanted the church to help get the conditions for which the unions are working, and not merely to pray for them. And the ministers listened to the speeches with the wisdom of men who promised their aid and sympathy in well chosen resolutions.

The meeting was called at the close of the meeting when after a harmonious settling of opinions between labor and the church, a reding Socialist walked up and asked for a hearing. The reverend gentlemen had been at attention for the wild hour, and were not in sympathy with one who was come in to undo all the work just accomplished. Some were for adjourning without ex-

Since that time H. L. Stone, secretary of the Y. M. C. A., says contracts have been let for elevator placing, boiler making, wiring and plumbing, and all to local union firms under strictly union conditions. Both sides are attempting to bring about a change through Mr. Rowles in his system, that all may be harmony of feeling again.

J. L. Ledwidge of the Structural Building Trades alliance, which includes all the unions of workers on buildings—plasterers, carpenters, plumbers, electrical wiring men, and the like—was the first speaker, and though he began with an apology that the labor unions did not attempt to raise orators, he gave an able and convincing talk which has not only convinced the labor unions but has also won the sympathy of the hearers. Though he spoke directly and gave the church and the ministry some hard knocks it was all done with tact and he recognized that their errors in regard to labor and unions were due rather to ignorance of misinformation than to willful hostility.

"The so-called leaders of labor," he said, "are expending all their energies in warding off the backward step to anarchy. Labor unions are not anarchistic as some people think. They make only fair demands and stand together to try to get them. When a man can do nothing. Nature demands an eight-hour day with eight hours for work, eight for sleep and eight for recreation. That is necessary to uplift a man. The reason for misunderstanding is because of ignorance and misinformation. If you all were conversant with labor conditions as they exist they would not exist.

"There is not the old belief in Christianity among the laboring classes that there was when I was younger. Laborers are now looking only for their material welfare. They are willing to listen to reason if they are themselves in good conditions. But if they do not receive fair treatment or what they deem fair, they are not amenable to reason.

"There are now about \$1,000,000 of church buildings going on in Portland, only two of the smaller buildings,
