Gore of Oklahoma deliver an address dealing with the national politics of the present time. Senator Gore is known as the Blind Orator and is one of the noted speakers of the nation. Elected to the United States senate for the short term from Oklahoma he is now in the midst of his campaign for re-election. Loyalty to his party, however, has caused him to forsake for the time his own interests and take the stump in the cause of Bryan and Kern. After his address here he will go to California and from there will work back to Oklahoma, spending the last two weeks of the campaign in that state.

The Gore meeting will be the big Democratic rally of the present campaign and it is certain that the senator will speak to a record house in the Armory as he bears the reputation of being one of the great orators of the country and in drawing card not only to members of his party, but to every one alike.

Taft's Attitude on Bank Deposits Special Prices

Denounces Guaranty Scheme as the Means of the Country's Ruination, and Chairman Hitchcock Worried About the Kansas Vote.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal) Chicago, Sept. 22.—It has become known here that Mr. Taft's attitude on the guaranty of bank deposits is giving Chairman Hitchcock and his campaign managers no end of worry, especially with respect to the situation in Kansas. In the latter state Governor Hoch has published a signed statement in which he earnestly and unreservedly indorses the plank of the Denver platform, declaring for the guaranty of bank deposits. Over the protest of Senator Long, who stood alone in opposition, the state Republican convention has pronounced for the guaranty of deposits. In his letter of acceptance, Mr. Taft gave a most vigorous and scathing denunciation of the plan, which he declared would, if adopted, "bring the whole banking system of the country down in ruin."

GERMANY MUST DO SOMETHING

Kaiser Himself Undertakes Task of Financial Reorganization.

Berlin, Sept. 22.—Realizing that something must be done at once to reduce the public debt and put the financial condition of the country on a more firm foundation, the kaiser is preparing to reorganize Germany's financial system. Having outlined the heaviest increase in taxation the kaiser has known in modern times, he is explaining why the money is imperatively needed.

Not only have the deficits of the treasury increased yearly, it is pointed out, but pressing obligations have been further increased, until the economic development of the fatherland is retarded, its credit damaged and its international prestige jeopardized. The public debt has grown from \$4,000,000 in 1877 to the surprising total of 1,022,000,000. Successive loans have been floated until the market is glutted with government securities and the level of other quotations is perilously low.

BRYAN ADDRESSES ANN ARBOR STUDENTS

He arrived here early this morning and went immediately to Ann Arbor, where he was given a rousing reception. Tonight he will speak here, and then leave for Columbus, Ohio.

CHIEF JUSTICE OF ARIZONA DEAD

Los Angeles, Cal., Sept. 22.—Webster Street, President McKinley's appointee as justice of the supreme court of Arizona, died here yesterday. He was a prominent lawyer and had been in a critical condition since last July. He was born at Salem, Ohio, in 1844 and was admitted to the bar at Chicago, Ohio, in 1871. He served as justice of the Nevada supreme court from 1897 to 1902.

CLOSE PRIMARY FIGHT IN JERSEY

Trenton, N. J., Sept. 22.—Reports from the primary held here throughout New Jersey today indicate that the nominations for the assembly are being closely contested by both Republicans and Democrats in nearly all districts. Much interest centers in the fight of Everett Colby, the young reformer, who fought victoriously for the Democratic ticket in his effort to control Essex county, in which is the city of Newark. Early this afternoon the results were doubtful.
