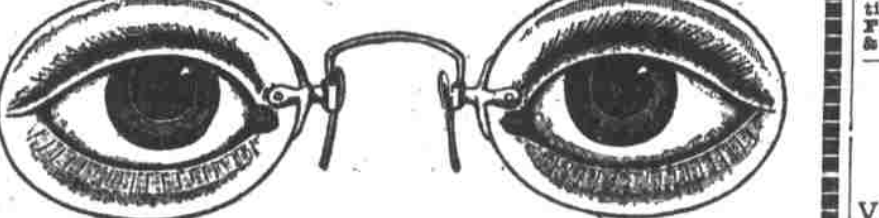
BUTTE BOYS SHIP ORE
