EXILE TO BLAME, SAYS STEWART

And If He's a Wreck Those Who Sent Him to Fort Grant Made Him Such.

(United Press Special Wire.)

Washington, Sept. 23.—When Colonel William F. Stewart, the so-called American Drayfus, who appeared before the retiring board ordered by the war department here this afternoon, is given an opportunity to introduce evidence he will endeavor to show that if his heart

is weak or he is disqualified in any other way, the falling is due to his enforced exile at Fort Grant, Ariz.

Charles Stewart, brother of the colonel and a San Francisco attorney, is here in his behalf and asserts that it can be proved positively that Colonel Stewart's health was excellent when he was sent to Fort Grant. He says the colonel was examined at that time and the records of the examination will be produced.

Orders were issued today by Brigadier-General William P. Hall summoning the retiring board to Washington barracks to be present at the examination, to be conducted by Colonel William H. Arthur and Major Guy Liddle, the two medical members of the board.

Upon their report of the physical condition of Colonel Stewart, taken in conjunction with the report of the surgeon at Fort Huachuca, who decided that Stewart was unable to stand the 90-mile test ride, the decision of the board will depend largely. Stewart will be permitted to introduce evidence in regard to his general health.

800 LINE IN SPECIAL LINE ALL ITS OWN

Another describes the trip down the Columbia to Portland, while a third tells of Portland, the Rose City. There are some excellent photographs of Portland, including the water front seen from the Madison street bridge, and bits of the scenery around the city and state. An excellent map of the 800-Spoke line in the Kootenay country is included in the book.
