A warrant has been issued for the arrest of John Doe Conklin, one of the Conklin brothers, contractors, with offices at the southwest corner of Thirty-fifth and Hawthorne avenues, on the charge of digging up the street, and falling to keep a red light burning as a danger signal. The Conklin brothers are excavating for a building on the north side of East Taylor street, between Thirty-ninth and Fortieth streets, and have dug a hole in the street to tap the water main. There was no danger signal over the hole Sunday night and the contractors were warned to install one. They did so, but last night the light was not burning. Complaint was made and the warrant issued in consequence.

The franchise of the railway company will include rights on more than 100 feet of street. The street residents complain that the company wants to push its lines out into the Russian town and that the fashionable residents will be brushed elbows with the subjects of the czar.
