Knight of the Thistle Will Take Away 8,000 Tons of Grain.

COASTERS HOMER AND ALLIANCE IN

Three steamers arrived in the harbor early this morning, two in the coastwise trade and one to load wheat for Europe.

The Knight of the Thistle reached the wharf of the Eastern & Western Lumber company at 10 o'clock this morning after having remained at Linn-ton overnight waiting for instructions where to go for her lining.

The Knight of the Thistle is the largest tramp vessel in the world for some time, but is by no means the largest ever to visit here.

The Knight of the Thistle is 466 feet long or just long enough to cover two average Portland blocks and the intervening street.

The coasters that arrived this morning are the Homer and Alliance, the former from San Francisco and the latter in command of Captain Olson from Coos Bay.

The steamer Eureka, Captain Noren from Eureka by way of Coos Bay, will be at Martin's dock this evening.

WATER ROUTE CHEAPER Tourists Must Decide on Route When Buying Ticket, However.

Beginning October 15 it will come \$5 cheaper for tourists to travel from Portland to San Francisco and return via the water route than if going by rail.

A passenger buying a round trip ticket from Chicago, for instance, to the coast and back, will find that the water route is the cheaper one.

This will give the steamboat people here a better opportunity to make reservations as they will be informed in advance how much might be expected for the coast for each steamer.
