

GAGGING NOTES BY APPEARANCES

Bryan Seems to Have Better of Taft in Eastern States.

Chicago, Oct. 1.—Effort was made by the Democratic campaign managers to learn accurately the degree of actual enthusiasm manifest by the masses when Judge Taft toured the west. Reports were made to the publicity bureau in person and I was permitted to listen to them.

Like two instances at illustration. Men who were present were H. H. Manson, himself state chairman of Wisconsin, to compare their mental notes with the notations Mr. Manson made, with the result that he submitted this verbal report:

The press dispatches carried the statement that Judge Taft addressed an enthusiastic meeting of all the employees of the Allis-Chalmers company, an immense concern engaged in the manufacture of various kinds of machinery near Milwaukee.

It was on a par with the other incident of Mr. Taft's coming to Chicago, to address the Independent Railway Men's club. The orchestra hall seating 2,000, was procured, although there were immensely larger halls available.

Mr. Bryan was here in the address more than 40,000 working men, besides hundreds of business men, and reviewed 25,000 union members in the address.

Furthermore, Judge Taft did not refer to guarantee of bank deposits while he was in Wisconsin. The governor of that state, a Republican, a year ago advocated such guarantee, and apparently the Republican was in the line to oppose it as a vicious one place and be silent in another place, notwithstanding he declared it would involve the whole banking system in ruin if adopted.

I noted that fact, because it seemed to me if he really believes it would so involve the banking system, he should warn the people of every state against a measure he averred he thought so perilous.

Mr. Manson stated that in his opinion Wisconsin would go to the Democratic column this fall, partly in resentment of the crushing of La Follette by the Taft machine.

Much of La Follette's following always has been from the Bryan Democrats, who have regarded him as quite close to the Republican side. La Follette has indulged Taft. Of course he did. Politically he had to. He hopes to regain control of the efforts of the Taft men who crushed him as completely as they could, and as he has been trying to crush him in Washington ever since he went to the senate.

La Follette's Friends. These La Follette-Bryan Democrats will support Bryan in November. They certainly cannot be expected to regard the senator's so-called improvement of Taft as anything but a victory. He had to go to lay ground for the hope again to regain power in that state.

Another report which was brought to headquarters was from Cincinnati. Judge Taft's home, at the Bryan meeting there September 24. The report has been substantiated by the Cincinnati Enquirer, which is not supporting Bryan. The report refers to an Enquirer article that Cincinnati never witnessed such an outpouring as the Chicago people who carried out cursory references to Bryan's greeting in Cincinnati. I have wondered from reading the newspaper of many sections whether the same minimizing of the Bryan goings and comings has not marked the news reports of many sections.
