PRESIDENT'S SON IS WASHING WOOL

Young Roosevelt appeared at the factory this morning at 8 o'clock and stayed around the office all day. The other operators at the mill watched his every move as he walked from one department to another, and when he went to the home of Vice-President Higgins for lunch a crowd followed, and another crowd followed him back to the factory a half hour later.

Tomorrow morning at 7 o'clock the president's son will go into the wool department and work the same as though his name was Smith and his father a hodcarrier.

CALIFORNIA DATES OF G. O. P. SPEAKERS

San Francisco, Oct. 1.—The Republican campaign in California will be started off tonight with two big meetings, one at Redding and another at Martinez.

Tonight's meetings are the first big meetings to be held this fall, and the Republican state central committee announces that the big guns in southern California will be fired next week.

No word has been received yet from Senator Dolliver, who is to speak here this month. If Senator Dolliver comes to the coast by way of Portland he will be able to stay here only two days, and will speak here and Los Angeles. If he arrives on the Southern route, he will probably have three meetings, the third at Oakland. The Oakland committee has offered \$1,000 for the meeting.

GALE SWEEPS OVER ARIZONA

(United Press Leased Wire.) Williams, Ariz., Oct. 2.—Damage amounting to hundreds of thousands of dollars is reported as the result of a gale which swept across Arizona at the rate of 100 miles an hour yesterday.

A fire here started in Rabbit Bros.' general merchandise store and destroyed six buildings in the heart of the business section. After the fire had been in progress about an hour, a terrific explosion of dynamite shattered the ruins of the Rabbit store. Bricks and debris were hurled into the air, breaking windows and scattering the lives of the people who were rushing through the streets.

The losses are as follows: Rabbit Bros., \$100,000; Harrell lodging-house and building, \$25,000; Hill & Kennedy, \$10,000; Joe Johnson, proprietor of building, \$18,000; Sanderson, \$10,000; Sweetwood saloon, \$25,000, and a Chinese restaurant, \$10,000, and building, \$15,000, owned by Johnson, mostly covered by insurance.

WHAT'S THE USE OF BIG NAVY

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, Oct. 2.—Regarding the pressing need which exists today for better naval facilities at San Francisco, it has petitioned Secretary of the Navy Metcalf to recommend in his forthcoming report to the president that a complete examination of all matters pertaining to the Mare Island yard.

In a letter to Secretary Metcalf it is pointed out that the board appointed by the president last year recommended a plan for deepening the channel in Mare Island strait and it is shown that there are but two draughts of sufficient size to accommodate war vessels on the entire west coast, while on the Atlantic seaboard, with a coast line but one-third greater, there are 11 draughts.
