Egg Plant Fritters.

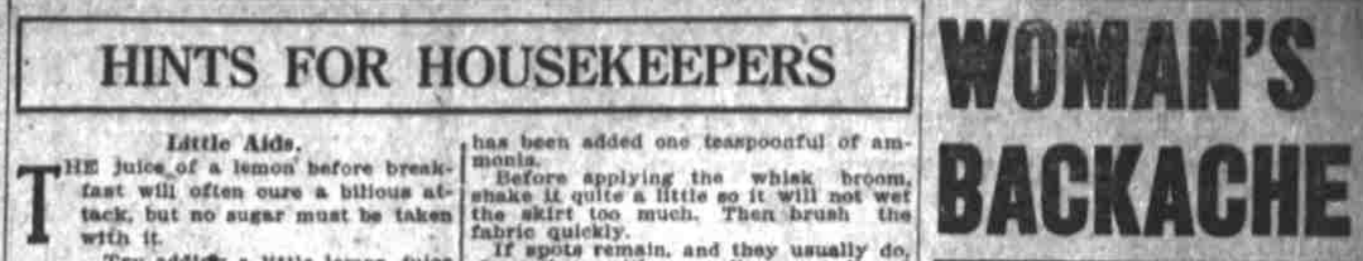
Throw into a kettle of boiling water, boil rapidly for ten minutes, then drain the egg plants and cut them into thin slices.
