

METROPOLITAN QUARTET WILL PRESENT ACT OF OLD OPERA

The distinguished artists forming the Metropolitan quartet, which will give the Wednesday evening concert at the Heilig, have prepared a wonderfully interesting program and one which almost parallels grand opera. The giving of almost an entire act from one of the best-loved of the old operas is something new for a concert company, and could not be successfully done by any but the soloists from such an organization as the Concord Metropolitan company. The concert on Wednesday evening at

the Heilig theatre is under the direction of Lois Steers-Wynn Coman and is the opening of a brilliant musical season, as well as being a most distinguished event in itself. This will be the first of the subscription concerts and the usual notable local people, notable musically as well as socially, will be in the audience. The artists forming the quartet are Madame Jacoby, the famous contralto, Madame Raybold, equally high in the artistic world among the sopranos, Campanari, the baritone, and Martin, the tenor. With the quartet will be young Rosenstein, the musical conductor, who will also be the accompanist for the solo and concerted work.

PATRICIA TO BE MANUEL'S BRIDE

Princess Who Has Rejected Suitors Galore Accepts Boy King.

(United Press Leased Wire.) London, Oct. 3.—Princess Patricia of Connaught, known as the prettiest girl in the British royal family, is studying the Catholic religion in preparation for embracing that faith before becoming the bride of Manuel II, the boy king of Portugal. Announcement of their betrothal, it was learned today, will be made at a royal dinner party this month. It will be necessary for the princess to enter the Catholic church before she becomes Manuel's bride, but like her cousin, Queen Victoria of Spain, she has

decided that she is willing to leave the Protestant faith for a throne.

The coming marriage is pleasing to Queen Amelie, Manuel's mother, and to the Portuguese people. The young king recently caused consternation in his court by declaring that he would never consent to a marriage of state and announced that he would wed his boyhood sweetheart, the daughter of a Portuguese nobleman. The girl was requested to leave the country and when Manuel learned of the charms of Princess Patricia he consented to carry out the wishes of his mother. King Edward is also pleased with the match and has given his consent.

Patricia has had plenty of proposals before this. A short time ago she was reported to be about to marry the Count of Turin. The Marquis of Anglessey was another favored suitor, but he failed to win. Alfonso of Spain wanted to marry her before he persuaded Victoria, but she said she would not "marry that horrid little man." Others who tried to win her and failed were Grand Duke Michael of Russia, Prince Eitel Fritz and others.

WORLD'S LOSS BRITONS' GAIN

New Patent Law's Confiscatory Clause Means Millions to J. B.

(United Press Leased Wire.) London, Oct. 3.—Prompt to take advantage of foreign enterprise whenever they can do so without cost to themselves, it is learned that a dozen of the largest English manufacturing companies have formed a syndicate to produce articles patented by American and continental inventors who are either unwilling or unable to open works in Great Britain. Leopold Farmer & Sons, who financed the corporation, are already applying for the cancellation of patents on a list of more than 200 articles which the new concern thinks it can manufacture profitably. The syndicate, which will claim no legal monopoly but its members believe that by getting first into the field they will be able to retain the lion's share of the trade. Several foreign concerns are protesting that it has been physically impossible for them to arrange as yet to open factories in England, as the new law provides they must do to retain their British patent rights, but the government has already turned a deaf ear to their pleas and the legal advisers of the syndicate have given the opinion that the aliens have small chance of redress in the courts.

The act provided that they must give sufficient guarantees, not later than August 25, that they would begin manufacturing in England within four years. It would have been unprofitable to do so in so many cases that the new syndicate expects to fall heir to millions of dollars' worth of confiscated business annually. Americans will be the heaviest losers, Germans the second and the French the third.

"Brown of Harvard" Next. Following "The Girl of the Golden West," the Baker stock company will present the famous college play, "Brown of Harvard," which will open the week next Sunday matinee, October 11. This play was seen here at the Heilig theatre only last January, with Harry Woodruff in the title role, and has but recently been released for stock. It will be given a splendid presentation by the Baker company, and will in all probability be assisted by one of the rowing crews of the city, for athletics play no small part in the plot.

Boy Shoots Big Deer. Helena Correspondence St. Paul Dispatch. Leo Stillway, the 15-year-old son of R. O. Stillway, has the proud distinction of killing one of the largest deer ever slain in Montana, or at least ever brought to Helena. The animal when hung measured nearly 12 feet from fore leg to hind leg and weighed in the neighborhood of 800 pounds. It was killed Monday on the Big Blackfoot, nearly 90 miles from Helena.
