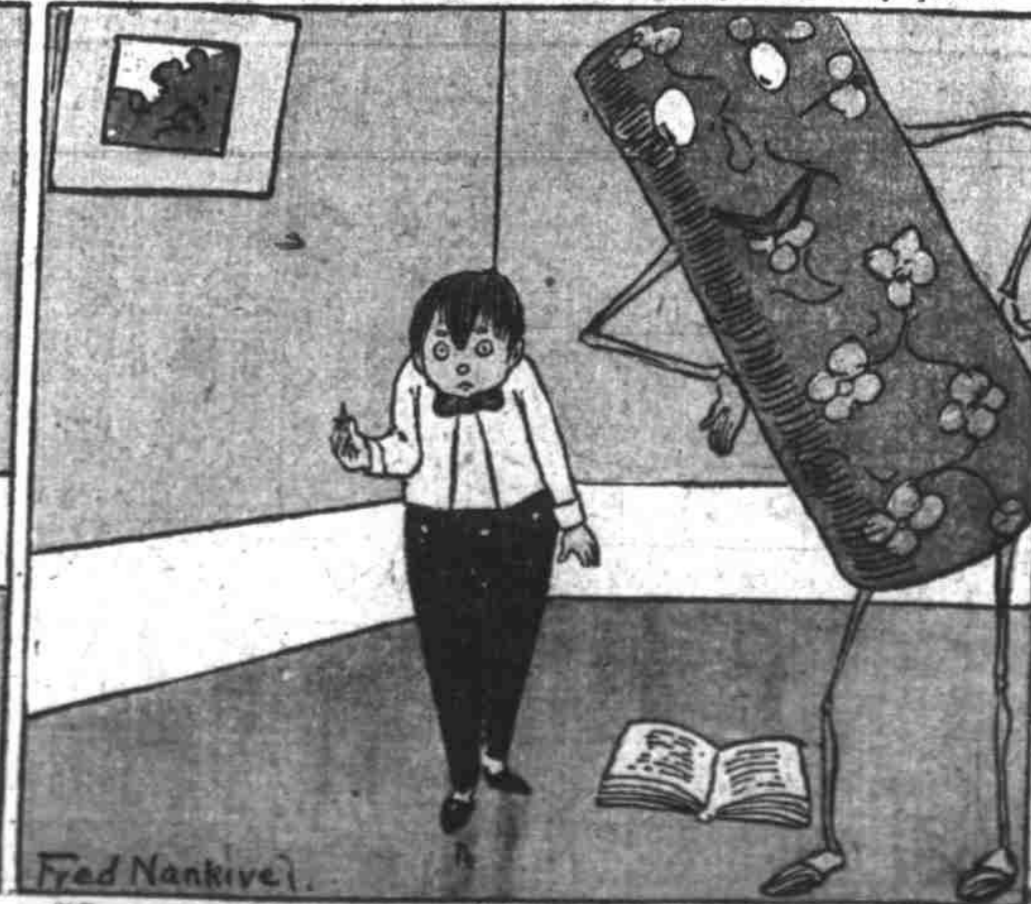
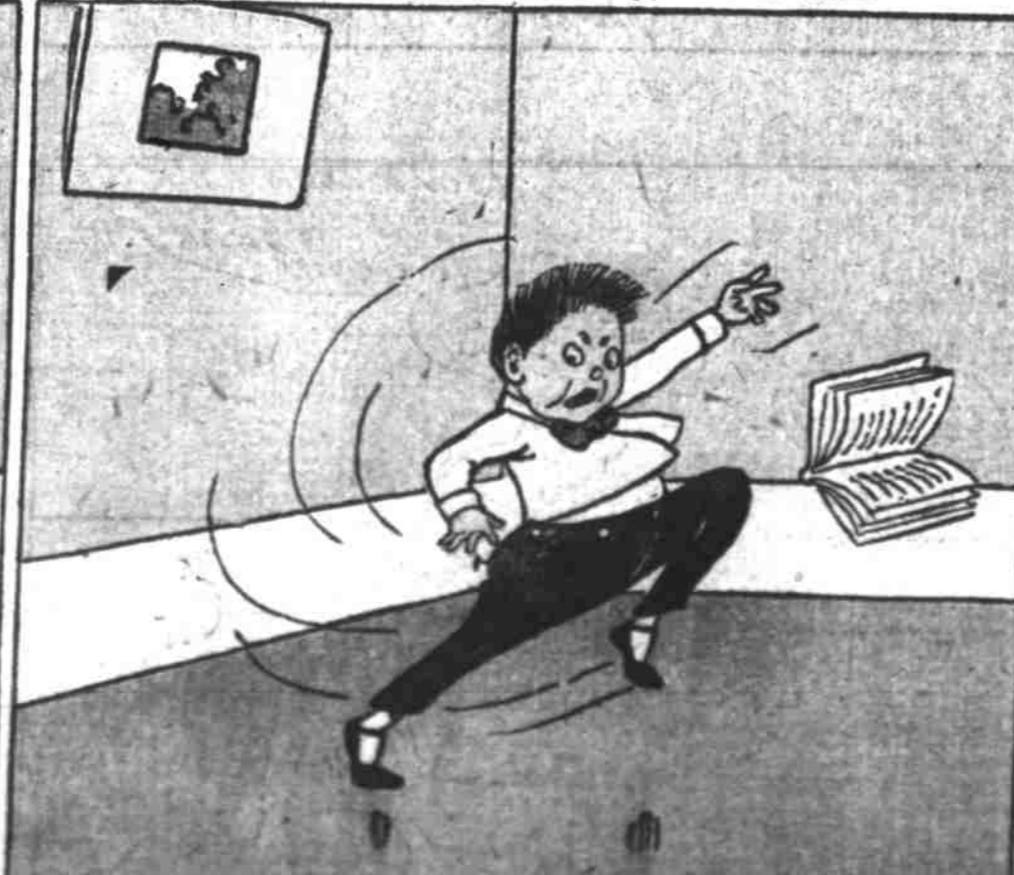
TED'S OBJECT SPELLING LESSON--C-A-R-P-E-T AND T-A-C-K
