

APPOINTMENTS TO THE SUPREME COURT

From the Boston Globe.

In his speech at Youngstown, Ohio, Governor Hughes of New York made the statement, which may or may not have some peculiar significance, that it is not improbable that the next president will appoint at least four judges of the United States supreme court.

Excluding the present incumbents, the average duration of the official life of the associate justices has been 15 months.

The average duration of the official life of the chief justices has been 13 years and five months.

A number of presidents have appointed four members of the court, Washington appointing 12 in all.

President Jefferson appointed three, President Madison two, President Quincy Adams one, while President Jackson appointed in all no fewer than six justices.

Presidents Tyler, Fillmore, Pierce Buchanan, Garfield and McKinley each appointed one justice.

President Lincoln had the appointment of five, including Chief Justice Chase, and President Cleveland also appointed that number in his two terms.

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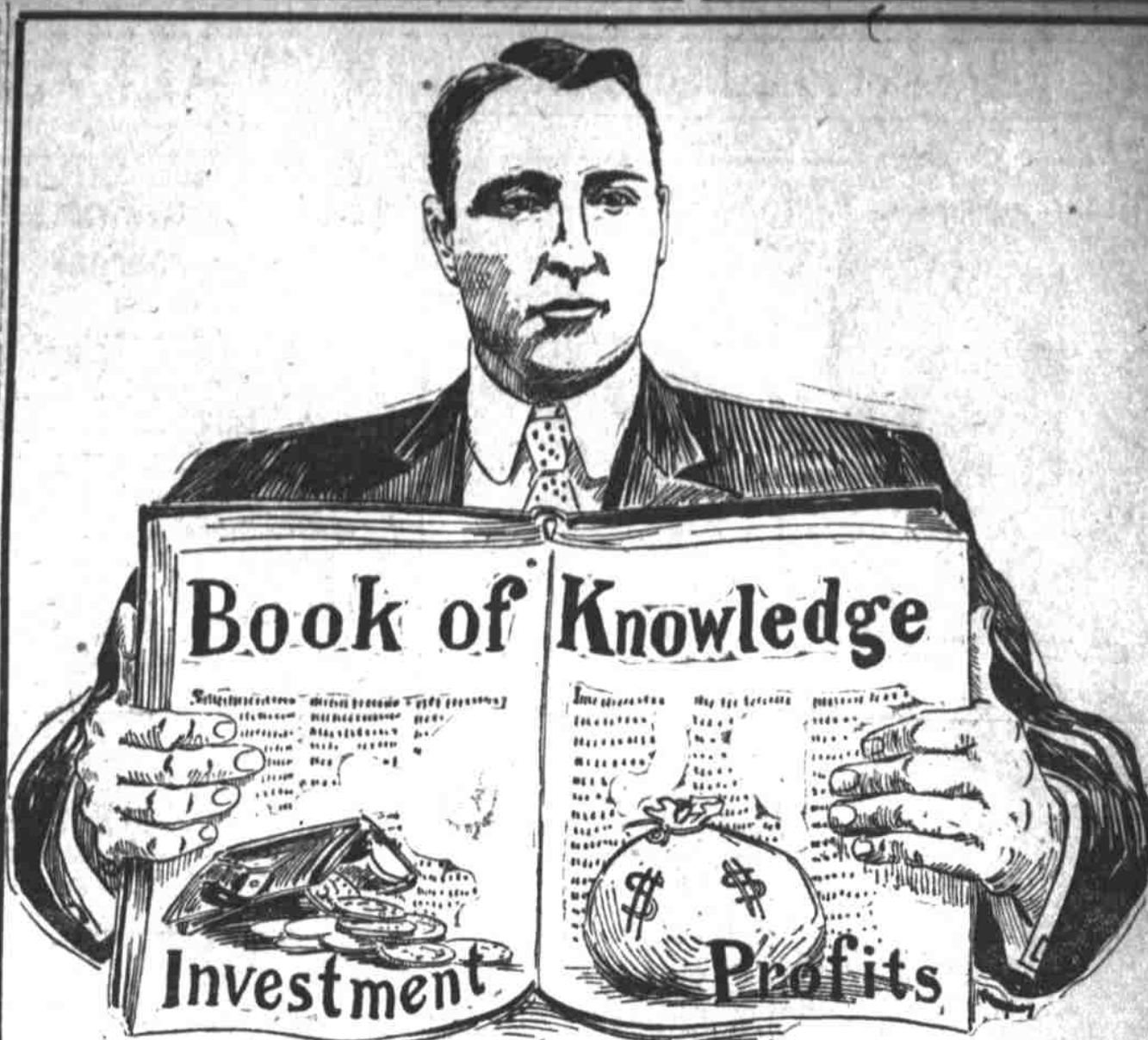
